
Approximately 45 academic scholarships ranging from \$100 to \$600 per year are available. All scholarships are awarded for one year and are to be used exclusively for payment of college fees. The renewal of scholarships is conditional on the student's maintaining a minimum grade of C (2.0 gpa) in academic work and satisfactory records in conduct and character. Application for renewal must be filed each succeeding academic year.

Eligibility for academic scholarships vary according to individual requirements. Interested students should read thoroughly the Scholarship section of the current catalogue. In addition to taking the scholarship examination, students should submit an application for admission, verify actual need, have good high school records, have high test scores (SAT or AST) and have recommendations.
