1 A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE 1972-73 BASKETBALL TEAM OF  
2 METHODIST COLLEGE, FAYETTEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA.

3           Whereas, Methodist College, a private church-supported  
4 institution of higher learning, located at Fayetteville, North  
5 Carolina, won the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference  
6 Basketball Tournament Championship for the 1972-73 season by  
7 defeating Greensboro College 113 to 90, setting a record for  
8 points scored by a winning team in a championship game; and

9           Whereas, Methodist College Basketball Team, under the  
10 fine coaching of Gene Clayton, compiled an overall record of 16  
11 wins and 5 losses with Harry Flipping, who scored 32 points in a  
12 single championship game, being voted "most valuable player" by  
13 the conference. Special recognition should be given to Harry  
14 Flipping, Elton Stanley, Greg Jones and Craig Knight for being  
15 named "all conference"; and

16           Whereas, the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference  
17 is composed of four-year liberal arts colleges in North Carolina  
18 and Virginia who operate athletic programs on a non-scholarship  
19 basis;

20 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives,  
21 the Senate concurring:

1 Section 1. That the General Assembly extends its  
2 congratulations to the coach and players of Methodist College  
3 Basketball Team for its fine 1972-73 season and wishes the  
4 continued success with its athletic program.

5 Sec. 2. That a copy of this resolution, duly certified  
6 by the Secretary of State, shall be sent to the coach and members  
7 of the basketball team by the Secretary of State.

8 Sec. 3. This resolution shall become effective upon its  
9 ratification.

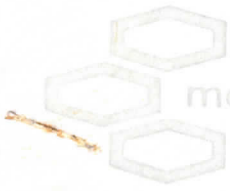

Coached by Howard Baum, the seven member team has been designated Area VI champions. Methodist College will be one of eight colleges and universities qualified for the national competition May 3-6.

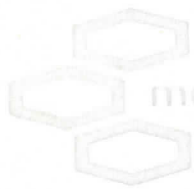
