"I've played with some of their players before and think it will be fun to play with Tim Sasser and Eric Baxley instead of playing against them. I will have the opportunity to find just how good they are." Sasser and Baxley are former Cape Fear standout pitchers.

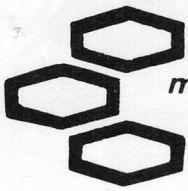

Where to from here? Di is in line for a vice-presidency in a few years, which would make her one of the youngest women banking executives around.

"I don't know--I often think that I'd like to leave New York in a few years. I like the Southern lifestyle--maybe in a city like Atlanta I could find the best of both worlds," Di comments.

The unique combination of careers and challenges in Diane's life has made her a staunch supporter of a liberal arts education. She found the versatility of her Methodist College education made her infinitely better prepared for the job market than the graduate of a highly specialized university.

"I took a great deal with me from Methodist--academically, I suppose the psychology courses have been the most helpful. But it was the personal development--the sense of self-worth--I gained at Methodist that has been my most valuable asset," says Di.

"No way could I have found that on a campus of 25,000 people. Methodist was my element--these students and faculty were my people. I come back almost every year to unwind and get back in touch with myself. Here's where I became and continue to become who I am. Methodist--whether 1964 or 1968 or 1978--is a part of home to me."
