CONTINUE TO RISE

FAYETTEVILLE--Methodist College contributions have topped the \$87,000 mark in the current community loyalty drive, according to Dr. Charles Speegle, coordinator.

"With 30% of the calls complete, the college has received \$55,000 in cash and pledges in unrestricted funds and \$32,000 in restricted gifts," says Speegle.

These figures reflect an increase in pledges over the 1979 figures after two weeks of solicitation. Methodist College Foundation conducts the annual campaign to fulfill a \$120,000 yearly commitment made by the Fayetteville community to the college.

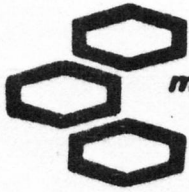

FAYETTEVILLE--Methodist College Foundation officers report that the 1980 community campaign figures are steadily climbing toward the \$120,000 unrestricted funds goal.

During the third week of the campaign, \$60,978 had been received for unrestricted use in addition to \$31,933 in restricted funds, reflecting a total of \$92,911 in community support thus far.

Dr. Charles Speegle, campaign coordinator, stated that "over 39% of the cards are now complete and gifts/pledges continue to be slightly higher than last year."
