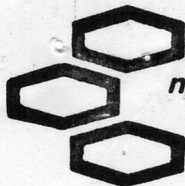

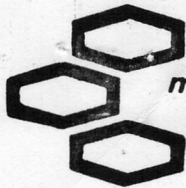

Over 170 Japanese students attended the 1979 East-West Foundation summer orientation last year on the Methodist campus, according to Dr. Ken Nishimura, director of the East-West Foundation.

"We are returning to Fayetteville and to Methodist College because of the hospitality and warmth of the people in your community," said Dr. Nishimura in an interview Monday.

"You created an atmosphere of welcome for our Japanese students that helped them make the transition of being a foreign visitor in a strange country with greater ease."

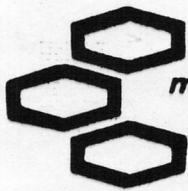
