Developmental Team have solicited \$88,391.00 in unrestricted
pledges and gifts in their 1980 Methodist College Loyalty
Fund Campaign.

According to Dr. Charles Speegle, campaign coordinator, this figure represents 74% of the \$120,000.00 pledged annually by the Fayetteville community for the support of Methodist College.

College officials have also received \$32,658.00 in restricted funds for the 1980 campaign.

With 58% of the calls completed, gifts are running even with the 1979 giving. The campaign will run through December 1980.

"Glenn Blackburn leaves Methodist College a better place for having shared three years of service here."


