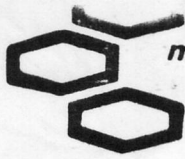

The arrival of over 170 foreign exchange students from Japan and China is scheduled for Thursday, July 3 with formal opening ceremonies scheduled for Monday evening, July 7 at 7:30. This exercise in international relations is important to this state and certainly to this nation.

I invite you to attend the opening ceremony of July 7 and to remain afterwards for a press conference to be held in the Publications Center immediately following. 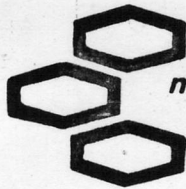

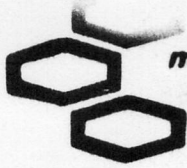

JAPANESE EXCHANGE STUDENTS ARRIVE;

FAYETTEVILLE - Over 170 foreign exchange students from Japan and China are expected to arrive at Methodist College here on Thursday, July 3, to begin an intensive 7-week program of language and cultural orientation.

These students arrived in New York today and will tour New York, Washington and Williamsburg before reaching their N.C. destination. While at Methodist, they will attend classes daily in preparation for enrolling in various colleges and universities in the fall.

Dr. Ken Nishimura, director of the East-West Foundation, will hold formal opening ceremonies for the foreign exchange students on Monday evening, July 7 at 7:30 in the Methodist College student union.

This is the third year that the Atlanta/Tokyo-based East-West Foundation has chosen to return to the Methodist College campus. Nishimura cites the cosmopolitan atmosphere of the community and the hospitality of the Fayetteville people as major reasons for Methodist's continued selection.

"An atmosphere of welcome is created for our students," says Nishimura, "making the transition of being a foreign visitor in a strange country an easier one."
