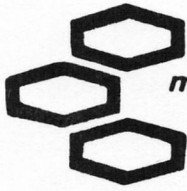

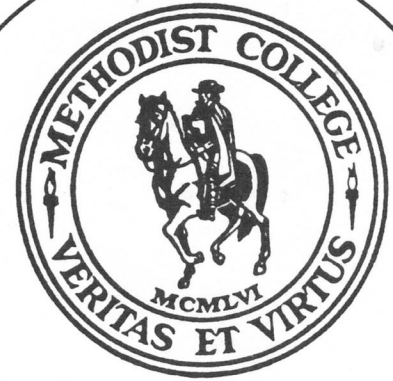

SUGGESTED FEATURE ANGLES ECCC '80

1. The role of the cheerleading sponsor: Is she a coach? A chaparone? An instructor? A driver?

Seven sponsors will attend ECCC '80 with their squads, living in the dorms and participating in the program just like a camper. One sponsor is from Virginia; the others from North Carolina - but each one has a unique (and often humorous) insight into that dubious honor of being the cheerleading sponsor.

2. The controversy over mounts in cheerleading: Are they dangerous? Are they necessary? Why do squads choose to implement them into their routines?

ECCC has a strong stand supporting cheerleaders efforts to strengthen their athletic ability, because we believe that cheerleaders are indeed athletes. We teach proper mounting procedures, the use of strategic spotters and proper dismounting at ECCC '80. Squads here can demonstrate four - high, tension or Atole fan mounts.

3. The Demands of Collegiate Cheerleading: travel? studies? accommodations?

ECCC '80 counselors represent Auburn University, Clemson University, UNC - Chapel Hill, Appalachian State University and East Carolina University. All are veterans of the demanding schedule of a college cheerleader and could provide an upclose look at the current status of college cheerleading.

4. Guys who are cheerleaders in high school: Why do they cheer? How much harrassment do they take from other students? What special talents can guys lend to a squad?

Five guys will attend ECCC as a part of squads - their particular emphasis being on partner stunts and mounts. They each have special reasons for choosing to cheer.

5. Teresa Jones - She's captured the dream!

Teresa Jones will be a counselor at ECCC '80 as a varsity cheerleader for the North Carolina Tar Heels. But her story began seven years ago when she first attended ECCC as a newly-elected cheerleader for the Carrington Junior High Cougars. She has attended ECCC every year since then - as a varsity cheerleader for Northern Durham - as an assistant counselor and junior varsity at Chapel Hill. Now it's her turn to shine and provide an example for the little cheerleaders looking for that dream.

Seven sponsors will attend ECCC '80 with their squads, living in the dorms and participating in the program just like a camper. One sponsor is from Virginia; the others from North Carolina - but each one has a unique (and often humorous) insight into that dubious honor of being the cheerleading sponsor.

2. The controversy over mounts in cheerleading: Are they dangerous? Are they necessary? Why do squads choose to implement them into their routines?

ECCC has a strong stand supporting cheerleaders efforts to strengthen their athletic ability, because we believe that cheerleaders are indeed athletes. We teach proper mounting procedures, the use of strategic spotters and proper dismounting at ECCC '80. Squads here can demonstrate four - high, tension or Atole fan mounts.

3. The Demands of Collegiate Cheerleading: travel? studies? accommodations?

ECCC '80 counselors represent Auburn University, Clemson University, UNC - Chapel Hill, Appalachian State University and East Carolina University. All are veterans of the demanding schedule of a college cheerleader and could provide an upclose look at the current status of college cheerleading.

4. Guys who are cheerleaders in high school: Why do they cheer? How much harrassment do they take from other students? What special talents can guys lend to a squad?

Five guys will attend ECCC as a part of squads - their particular emphasis being on partner stunts and mounts. They each have special reasons for choosing to cheer.

5. Teresa Jones - She's captured the dream!

Teresa Jones will be a counselor at ECCC '80 as a varsity cheerleader for the North Carolina Tar Heels. But her story began seven years ago when she first attended ECCC as a newly-elected cheerleader for the Carrington Junior High Cougars. She has attended ECCC every year since then - as a varsity cheerleader for Northern Durham - as an assistant counselor and junior varsity at Chapel Hill. Now it's her turn to shine and provide an example for the little cheerleaders looking for that dream.
