METHODIST SOCCER TEAM
SEES POST-SEASON DREAMS
COMPLETELY SHUT OUT

FAYETTEVILLE--Two weeks ago Coach Mason Sykes Monarch soccer team was riding high: sporting a 9-2 record, reaching for a national ranking and hoping for NCAA post-season play.

It's all over now and no-one is quite sure what happened.

"If anyone would have told me two weeks ago that our team would lose the last four games and fail to score but two goals during those four games, I honestly would have believed they were lying," says Coach Sykes.

That's what happened, though. Coming back from fall break, the Methodist team travelled to Rocky Mount to win their last game of the season, defeating the N.C. Wesleyan Bishops 2-0. Sophomore Denny Laird scored both goals for the Monarchs.

A fired-up Virginia Wesleyan team hosted the Monarchs for their homecoming game and handed the Methodist guys their third loss, 4-2. The Marlins began their attack immediately, scoring twice in the first two minutes of play.

"We were still tucking our shirttails in, I think," says Sykes, only half-joking. "Virginia Wesleyan has a good team. They tied Averett and UNC-G--I was impressed with their caliber of play."

'STAR-SPANGLED GIRL' OPENS IN DINNER THEATRE PRODUCTION

FAYETTEVILLE--Neil Simon's Star-Spangled Girl will open Monday, Nov. 24 in a dinner theatre production directed by Dr. Wayne Preslar and starring Jeneal Whorton, Keith Langford and Phil Fallin.

The three-act comedy will also be presented on Tuesday evening, Nov. 24. Both shows will begin at 6 o'clock with dinner in the Student Union. The menu includes juice, salad, chicken in white wine sauce, shoe peg corn, rolls, tea, coffee and dessert for Monday evening. The entree for Tuesday evening will be shish-kabob with wild rice.

Cost will be \$2.25 per person, payable at the door. Meals are free to dormitory students. Because of a 100-seat limit, reservations for dinner are required. A reservation fee of 50¢ per person will be charged.

"Simon's 'Star-Spangled Girl' is particularly relevant in this politically-charged election year," says Preslar.

"The play contains comments on the value of conflicting opinions and the emergence of truth from this conflict."

Although there have been minor adaptations of Simon's 1966 script, the text remains essentially as Simon wrote it: a commentary on the attraction of opposites, the eternal love triangle and the physics of love.

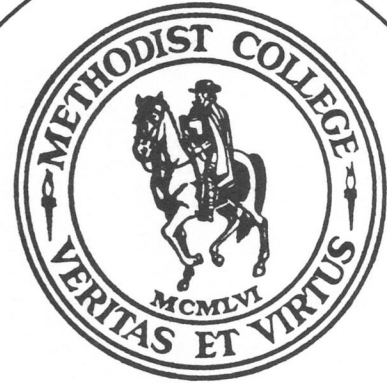

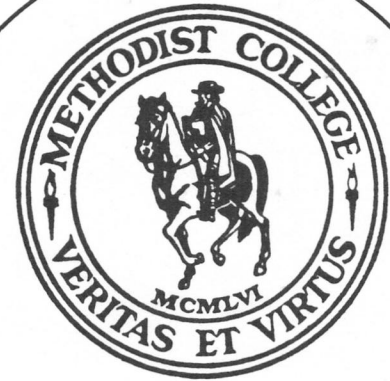
