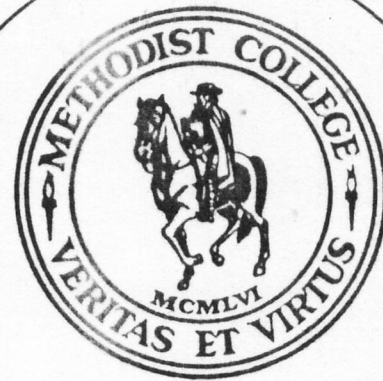

Playwright Maxwell Anderson
Ranks High Among American Dramatists

Fayetteville--The late Maxwell Anderson is regarded by numerous critics as the second-best American playwright succeeded only by Eugene O'Neill. With the world premiere of his musical adaptation of Huck Finn, Raft on the River planned for Wednesday, April 15, local interest in Maxwell Anderson has surged.

Anderson (1888-1959) received the Pulitzer Prize for Both Your Houses and the first Drama Critics' Circle Award ever given for Winterset. He later received a second Circle Award for High Tor.

A prolific writer, Maxwell Anderson wrote numerous film scripts and many of his plays were translated to the screen. Among his films are Anne of the Thousand Days, Key Largo, Knickerbocker Holiday, Mary of Scotland, Saturday's Children (5 versions), The Bad Seed, The Eve of St. Mark, What Price Glory (3 versions), Joan of Lorraine, Winterset, Lost in the Stars and Elizabeth and Essex.

In 1942 Anderson visited nearby Fort Bragg, a visit which later provided the basis of his radio script "From Reveille to Breakfast" and his play and movie script about war called The Eve of St. Mark.

Methodist College professor Dr. Sue Kimball discovered the script of Raft on the River while doing research at Louisiana State University. After receiving permission from Maxwell Anderson's widow, Methodist College has begun production on Raft on the River,

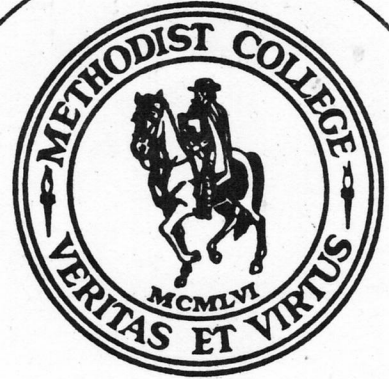

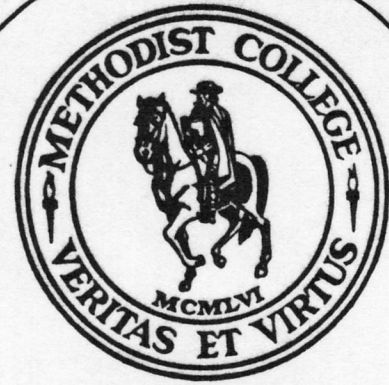

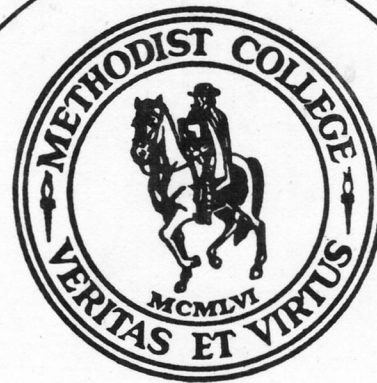

METHODIST COLLEGE TO HOST
WORLD PREMIERE OF MUSICAL
'RAFT ON THE RIVER'

FAYETTEVILLE--It isn't often that Fayetteville has the opportunity to be the site of a world premiere stage production. It is even less often that a small liberal arts college has the opportunity to host such a production. But both will come to pass on April 15, 1981 when Methodist College hosts the world premiere performance of Maxwell Anderson's Raft on the River.

The late playwright Maxwell Anderson wrote Raft on the River as a musical interpretation of Mark Twain's Huckleberry Finn. It existed only in the original handwritten form until Methodist professor of English Dr. Sue Kimball discovered the play while reviewing a book on Anderson's writing during a study of Southern literature at Louisiana State University in 1979.

Intrigued and excited by her discovery of the musical with book and lyrics by Anderson and an incomplete score by the late Kurt Weill, Dr. Kimball wrote to the widows of both men, seeking permission to produce the musical. Lotte Lenya, Weill's widow, refused permission to use Weill's music. Mrs. Anderson, however, agreed to having the work produced at Methodist College and gave added permission for a new score to be added.

After submitting representative scores to five of the 21 songs in the play to Mrs. Anderson for her approval, Dr. Jack

It is even less often that a small liberal arts college has the opportunity to host such a production. But both will come to pass on April 15, 1981 when Methodist College hosts the world premiere performance of Maxwell Anderson's Raft on the River.

The late playwright Maxwell Anderson wrote Raft on the River as a musical interpretation of Mark Twain's Huckleberry Finn. It existed only in the original handwritten form until Methodist professor of English Dr. Sue Kimball discovered the play while reviewing a book on Anderson's writing during a study of Southern literature at Louisiana State University in 1979.

Intrigued and excited by her discovery of the musical with book and lyrics by Anderson and an incomplete score by the late Kurt Weill, Dr. Kimball wrote to the widows of both men, seeking permission to produce the musical. Lotte Lenya, Weill's widow, refused permission to use Weill's music. Mrs. Anderson, however, agreed to having the work produced at Methodist College and gave added permission for a new score to be added.

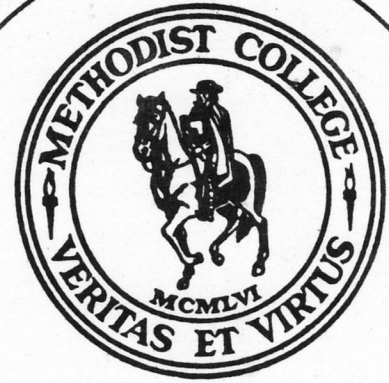
After submitting representative scores to five of the 21 songs in the play to Mrs. Anderson for her approval, Dr. Jack Peyrouse received the final go-ahead for the production in early January.
