Dr. Thomas Elleman, former professor of nuclear engineering at N.C. State, says there is no energy crisis, only a technology crisis.

"We have abundant energy from numerous sources--we simply haven't perfected the technology to harness it yet, but we will," predicts Dr. Elleman.

Speaking to Methodist College students during a National Energy Week seminar, Dr. Elleman asserted the moderate view that there is no single solution to meeting America's energy needs--not solar, nuclear or fossil.

"Solutions are to be found in a combination of all energy sources," Dr. Elleman says. "The American people must also be more realistic in their safety expectations--realizing that there is no energy source that can be used without risk."

Statistics cited by Dr. Elleman show natural gas as the safest source of energy, followed closely by hydro-energy and nuclear energy. Solar energy is further down the list because of the high copper and mineral needs.

Dr. Elleman, who currently serves as vice-president of nuclear safety and research in the Carolina Power and

Dr. Elleman, who currently serves as vice-president of nuclear safety and research in the Carolina Power and Light Company, asserted his belief that nuclear power is part of the energy answer for the United States. According to Elleman, there are currently eighty-three licensed nuclear plants in the United States located in the northeast and southeast portions of the nation. These locations have been selected predominately because of their population centers, the need present and the water available. by the year 2000, 50% of the nation's power will be coming from electricity and 25% of that power will be nuclear provided. Although this amount is substantial, it is still less than what was anticipated.

"There is no technical barrier to the disposal and handling of nuclear waste, according to the National Academy of Science report," cites Dr. Elleman. "The problem is political-which states should handle nuclear waste, when should these nuclear waste sites be completed, etc."

Reminding the Methodist College student body that radiation is not simply a nuclear by-product, Dr. Elleman asserted that radiation naturally occurring in the United

States and throughout the world equals about 200 millimeters per person per year. Sources of this naturally occurring radiation are the atmosphere, concrete walls, natural fallout and X-rays. Currently only .001 millimeter per year per person is emitted from nuclear plants. Although that could account for one to two cancers per year from this radiation, Dr. Elleman asserts that it's considerably less than cancers caused from any other source.

"The risk with nuclear energy is not zero, but it is considerably less than many alternative sources of energy," claims Dr. Elleman.

The Chinese symbol for crisis, according to Dr. Elleman, is composed of two characters which when taken separately mean opportunity and disaster. Dr. Elleman asserts that the energy crisis creates for us an opportunity to broaden our horizons and lessen our dependence on foreign sources of energy. He does not believe that the American people will allow the energy crisis to be a disaster for this society.

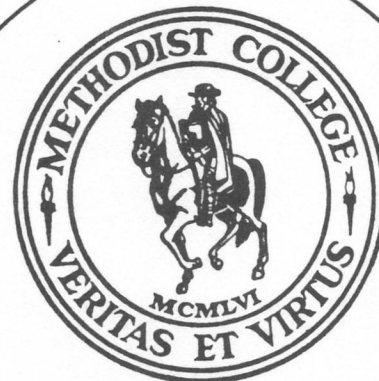

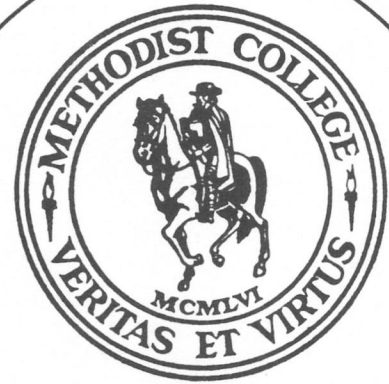
