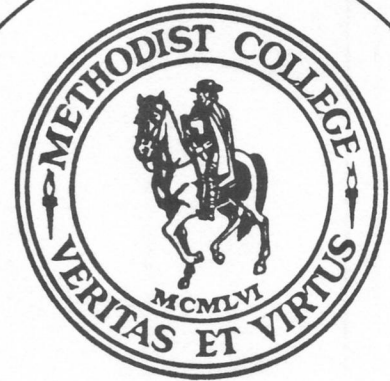

Attached you will find a news release on A Man and His God, scheduled for production in Hensdale Chapel on Sunday, April 19, at 8:00 P.M. Mark Mooney, senior from Baltimore, Maryland, chose as the topic of his senior acting recital: my relationship with God, as seen through three one-act plays. The one-act plays he has chosen are "St. George and the Dragon," "Children in the Playpen," and "Jesus Christ Superstar"(selections).

The feature quality I see in this play is that it represents the earliest form of Christian drama which were the morality plays and the mystery plays. Chancel drama has enjoyed a resurgence in popularity during the decade of the 70's as seen by the elaborate productions found in numerous churches during Easter, Christmas and other significant religious holidays. This series of three one-act plays reminds us that the earliest beginnings of Christian drama were bathed in simplicity and symbolism.

Mark Mooney is an excellent actor. It is he that provides a focus for A Man and His God. His sensitivity of portrayal, his inborn grasp of humor and his depth of faith all come across as he portrays different roles within the trilogy.

I sincerely hope that you will be able to join us for the final production of A Man and His God on Sunday evening, April 19. There will be two dress rehearsals prior to the final performance if you would like to attend one of those. Mark Mooney will also be available for interviews.
