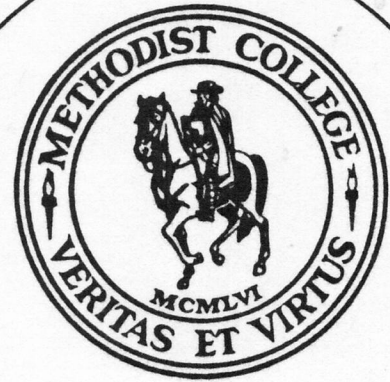

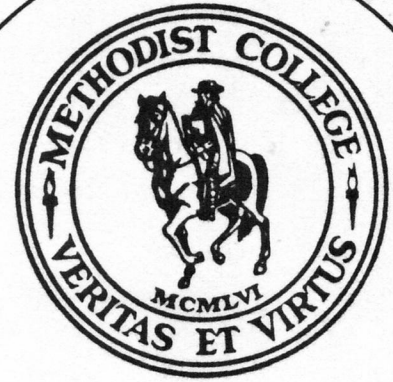

TERRY SANFORD TO ADDRESS
METHODIST COLLEGE GRADUATES

FAYETTEVILLE--Dr. Terry Sanford, president of Duke University and former governor of North Carolina, will deliver the commencement address during formal graduation exercises at Methodist College on Sunday, May 3 at 2 o'clock in Reeves Auditorium.

Formerly of Fayetteville, Sanford began his public service career as a special agent of the F.B.I., followed closely by a stint as Assistant Director of the Institute of Government at UNC. Prior to his term of office as governor (1961-65), Sanford served as president of the North Carolina Young Democrats Club, secretary-treasurer of the North Carolina State Ports Authority and a member of the North Carolina State Senate. Sanford has authored two books, But What About the People? in 1966 and Storm Over the States in 1967.

From 1948-1960, Sanford was a partner of the law firm Sanford, Phillips, McCoy and Weaver in Fayetteville. He served as chairman of the Methodist College Board of Trustees from 1958-1968. A graduate of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Dr. Sanford was inaugurated president of Duke University in 1970.
