METHODIST PLACES NINE ON ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

FAYETTEVILLE--Methodist College had the distinction of placing nine athletes on the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference All-Academic team for 1980-81, second highest in the conference behind St. Andrews.

Currently, the competition is limited to those students competing in men's athletics only. To qualify for the All-Academic team a varsity athlete must carry at least a "B" (3.0) average for each semester of school during the current year. St. Andrews had 23 representatives on the team.

METHODIST INVITATIONAL SOCCER TOURNAMENT MATCHES

PFEIFFER, FLORIDA TECH, ST. ANDREWS, METHODIST

FAYETTEVILLE--A strong four-team field will highlight the second Methodist College Invitational Soccer Tournament scheduled for September 11 and 12 on the Methodist College soccer field, according to Methodist coach Mason Sykes.

Pfeiffer, Carolina Conference powerhouse, will face St. Andrews in the kick-off game Friday at 2 o'clock. Coach Darryl Saunders' Pfeiffer team boasts an even 1980 record coming into the pre-season tourney with 8-8.

"We are expecting to build the freshman talent around a strong core of experience in Joe Lorenz, Kurt Bergland and Kevin Clay," says Saunders.
