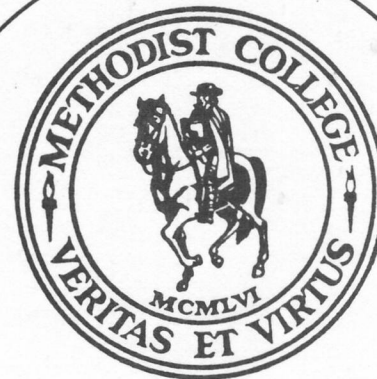

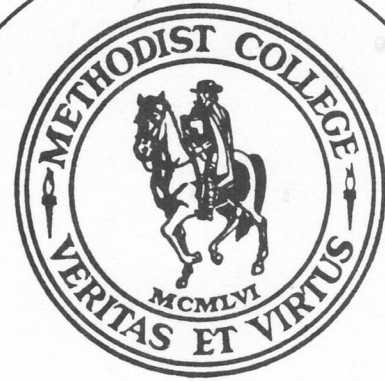

Rowland H. Bainton's Christain Attitudes Toward War and Peace will provide the main text for the course, supplemented by reading selected from primary sources. Lectures will be given on the issues raised in the historical material as a basis for consideration of contemporary issues.

Among topics to be considered for selection in exploring contemporary issues will be the following: morality and modern warfare, structural violence, nuclear war, revolutionary violence in the Third World, conscience and war, and non-violent protest.

"In general, the course will help the student to prepare for responsible participation in a society in which issues of war and violence are so significant," projected Pulliam.
