Thomas led the conference throughout the season in recorded saves and shots on goal with 286 saves and 462 shots on goal. Setting school records in each category, the 20-yr. old Crisfield, MD native had his best season ever at Methodist.

One key to Thomas' selection was his 0-0 shutout of nationally-ranked Averett College. DIAC coaches voted Thomas All-Conference goalie over UNC-Greenboro's Dugan and Virginia Wesleyan's Redder.

All-Conference selection adds to Thomas' "Player of the Week" and Most Valuable Homecoming Player 1981 honors. He was a second-team All-DIAC selection in 1979 and also DIAC "Freshman of the Week" in 1979.

Laird, also a Crisfield, MD native, is a three-time veteran on the All-Conference squad, having copped honors in 1979, 1980, and 1981.
