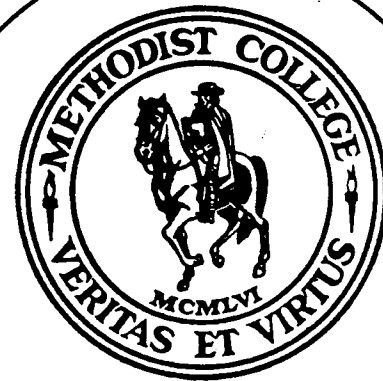
Spears is currently completing work on "The Electric Valley," a film documentary on the Tennessee Valley Authority to be released this summer.

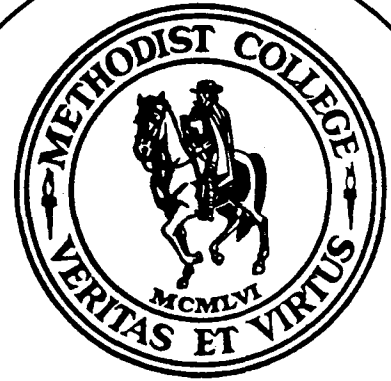

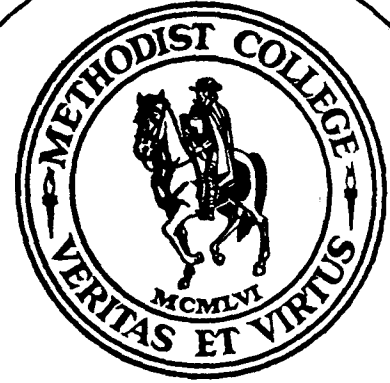
