METHODIST COLLEGE DELEGATION

PASSES BILL AT NCSL

FAYETTEVILLE-Methodist College authored one of the eleven bills passed recently at the annual North Carolina State Student Legislature in Raleigh.

The Methodist bill called for the mandatory use of headlights during rain or fog and for violation of this offense to be a misdemeanor driving offense.

Citing precedents in Florida and Georgia, the Methodist delegation pulled the bill through a highly-debated House vote and an easy voice vote in the Senate.

Of the 24 bills submitted by the 18 colleges represented, eleven passed. Topics included sunshine bargaining, affluent fees, human subjects for experimentation and designated smoking areas among others.

Rick Kugelmann of Fayetteville chaired the Methodist delegation. Diane Croom of Fayetteville authored the Methodist bill.

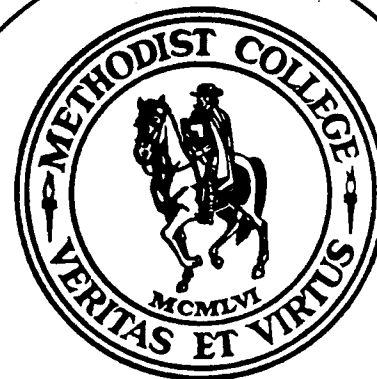

NATIONALLY-RANKED
METHODIST TEAM

FAYETTEVILLE-Methodist College is leaning heavily on the bats of three Florida guys in their quest for a NCAA baseball championship.

Bill Robinson, sophomore centerfielder from Titusville, is batting .321 for the sixth-ranked Monarchs and has scored 41 runs. Robinson was a star player at Titusville High School during his high school career.

Dave Hackley, junior third baseman from Jacksonville, has connected for an average of .327. Hackley transferred from Florida Junior College.

The Monarchs' second strongest batter is Fred White, junior from Orlando, batting .349 behind Mike Currie's .355. White has 23 RBI'S for the season and played his high school ball at Colonial High School.

Methodist has been nationally-ranked all season by Collegiate Baseball, going from seventh to sixth place as of April 8, 1982 with 10 games remaining in the season.
