"Because I love it!" Ishee enthusiastically responds.

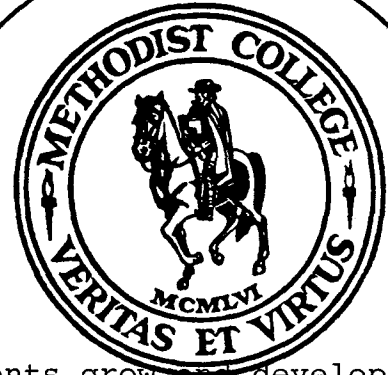

Methodist College Vice-President Bill Lowdermilk equates the college's cultural life and exemplary teaching with Ishee.

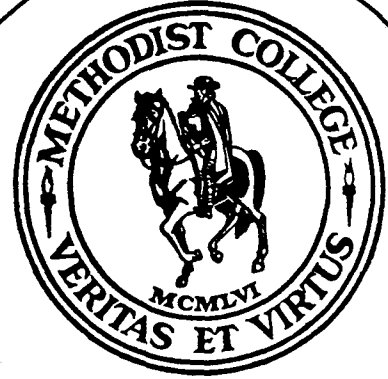

"Methodist is on the verge of becoming an exceptionally fine educational institution," she smiles confidentially, envisioning the future of the college and expressing pride at her part in its past.

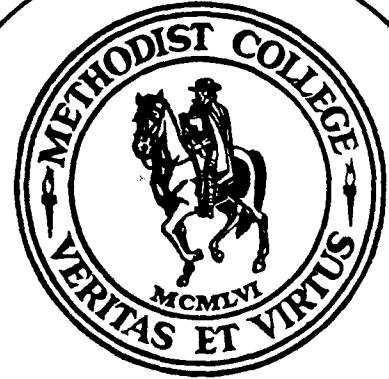
