

Methodist College accepts proudly its classification as a fouryear residential college of liberal arts and sciences supported in many part by the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. We are all of those things: four-year--The 23 majors offered on the College campus are awarded under four baccalaureate Methodist including the bachelor of arts degree, bachelor of science degrees degree, bachelor of music degree, and bachelor of applied science residential college--Four modern fully degree; air-conditioned dormitories house students from 14 different states and 10 foreign countries; liberal arts and sciences--Students get the full picture in a liberal arts curriculum, learning how to develop concepts and think creatively; supported by the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church--Methodist College proclaims its strong faith with an energized religious campus life for all students as well as a highly-respected major in religion for students seeking professional training.

Yes, we are all those things--but we are so much more!

We are actively involved in computer integration. Look at that house "computer integration." Realizing that computers will be a major part of the lifestyle of the coming decades, Methodist College is seeking to integrate the computer into multiple phases of student life. In addition to the obvious uses in math classes and computer science courses, we are one of the first colleges in the nation to incorporate computers into our composition courses. CAC, as the Computer-Assisted Composition program is known on cameus, provides

every incoming freshman with the opportunity to use the IBM-PC laboratory for instruction in freshman composition. Because of the highly innovative nature of this CAC program, Methodist College is a showcase for other colleges interested in beginning a similar program.

Business and Economics majors participate in simulation games on computers which provide them with the chance to invest in stocks, run a company, audit accounts, provide accounting read-outs, and numerous other opportunities.

Psychology majors frequently use computers in the assimilation of data gathered in experiments and investigation. Physical Education majors use computers for setting up complex tournament play and for the analysis of team play.

We have only scratched the surface with computers—we find new ways to use them everyday. The important thing is that Methodist College students will not be afraid of computers or the coming of the computer age. By graduation, the Methodist College student will know exactly how to use the computer to increase his productivity and to lighten his work load. He may well not know how to repair a computer; he probably won't know how to program a computer elaborately; but he will know how to harness the computer for his special uses.

Methodist College has added new majors to its curriculum in an effort to prepare its students for the job markets of the 21st Century, including majors in computer science, communications,

special education, management psychology and arts management. Still, it is important for you to realize that Methodist College really isn't trying to teach you every thing you need to know for that first Instead, we are trying to teach you everything you job you have. need to know to be successful in every job you have. The average professional will change professions three times in his lifetime--we want you to have all the tools to make those changes, including the ability to be flexible and the vision to develope concept into reality. You frequently hear that a liberal arts education teaches you a little bit about a lot of things—that's true. What you also need to know is that a liberal arts education teaches you most of all about yourself. It teaches you to be a participant in life--not a spectator, watching from the sidelines. It teaches you to realize that people are the only real commodity and that your personal ethics are the only safeguard to that commodity.

Methodist students say it best sometimes.

"I count for something here—the small college environment helps develop personal relationships not only with other students but also with faculty and staff," says senior voice major Richard Bicoy of Hawaii.

"The first thing that struck me about Methodist was that preverybody smiles at you and speaks," added freshman Brenda McKimens, All-Conference women's soccer player from Fairfax, VA. "That friendliness isn't just on the surface—now that I am a student here, I realize that people here have an unusual spirit of community. We really do care about each other."

"After going home for the holidays my freshman year, I realized that I really had two homes now. I missed my friends and even--if you can believe this--my classes!" says Kyle Frost, golfer from Torrington, CT.

Methodist students do have a lot of pride in themselves and the way they live, but don't think that campus life is confined to studying. We have one of the largest offerings of intercollegiate sports of any NCAA Division III college with sixteen varsity sports, including eight women's sports. By the way, cheerleading is a varsity sport at Methodist College for both men and women and our golf team has travelled to the NCAA Division III National Tournament for four consecutive years, finishing second in the nation last year.

Methodist College students are involved in everything from politics and the N.C. State Student Legislature to major theatre productions. ..from Beta Beta Beta science fraternity to Lambda Chi Alpha, Pi Kappa Phi and Alpha Xi Delta social fraternities. ..from student government to student publications, including the national award-winning campus newspaper SMALL TALK.

There are 34 small, private liberal arts colleges in North Carolina alone and all of them are significant institutions that will help you grow into the successful person you want to be. Methodist College isn't the only good college around—but we are one of them. We can assure you of a quality education that will prepare you for the future and we can make you happy.
