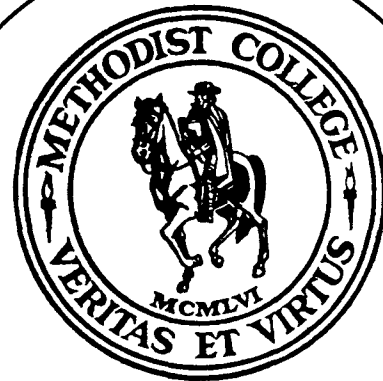

Students selected to participate in the competition weekend were given two CLEP tests and interviewed by a panel of Methodist College personnel. Scholarships, ranging from \$750 yearly to full tuition Presidential Scholarships valued at approximately \$16,000 over four years, will be awarded by totaling test scores with interview results.
