SUBJECT: First Statewide Cheerleading Coaches Clinic

DATE: April 18, 1985

Cheerleading has been in the news more in the past year than in the past century—in both positive and negative lights. National network coverage of college and high school cheerleading competitions brought the "new age of cheerleading" into homes complete with intricate stunts, flashy gymnastics and challenging mounts. National coverage of the near-fatal fall of Robin Davidson, UNC-CH junior varsity cheerleader, brought the dangers of cheerleading into clear and troubling focus.

North Carolina joins Kentucky and Kansas in calling for a statewide acceptance of cheerleaders as athletes, a statewide adherence to safety guidelines for cheerleaders (see attached), and a statewide effort to provide trained and certified cheerleading coaches in the schools of the state (see attached). In cooperation with the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, Sports Medicine Division, Methodist College is conducting the first state cheerleading coaches clinic on Friday and Saturday, April 26-27, 1985.

For the first time, cheerleading coaches from across the state will meet to receive instruction in safety, preventive fitness, proper mount techniques, dance, etc. They will analyze live demonstrations from award-winning high school and college squads as well as videotapes of national competitions. A major purpose of the clinic will be the election of a committee to begin the organization of a statewide cheerleading coaches association.

Cheerleading will continue to be news for the next year or two as battles ensue over funding, liability, coaching supplements, and the very real problem of creating that delicate balance in cheerleading between performing and creating spirit. I invite you to be on the cutting edge of these changes—and there's no better place to get a feel for them than at the first statewide clinic for cheerleading coaches at Methodist College on April 26-27. Please call me if I can assist you in setting up interviews or arrange for you to sit in on particular sessions.
