PURDUE UNIVERSITY OFFERS

'HOW TO STUDY IN COLLEGE' COURSE

AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE--Many individuals about to enter college believe they know how to study. Many know they don't. In either case, the ability to study effectively is essential for successful college students. Many intelligent, but unprepared, freshmen struggle to make the adjustment to a new college study experience.

More than 65,000 college-bound high school graduates from throughout the United States have solved the problem and received a head start on their peers by enrollment in the Purdue University "How To Study In College" seminar developed by two Purdue University professors in 1964. Numerous colleges and over 150 YMCA's across the country have offered the program.

The popular one-week, four-evening course will be offered this summer on the Methodist College campus. Gwen Sykes, Director of Special Projects at Methodist, says the course provides useful, practical answers to such questions as: What two simple study techniques will almost guarantee one letter grade higher in every course?
