FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- The spirit of brotherhood, patriotism and the freedom of American citizenship will be celebrated on Friday, Nov. 8, when Cu Phung, a junior at Methodist College, will be naturalized as a citizen of the United States of America.

The 10 a.m. ceremony, hosted by his fraternity brothers at Methodist, will be held on the lawn of Horner Administration Building, part of the central mall of the Methodist campus. The members of Lambda Chi Alpha, Sigma Zeta Theta chapter, will host a reception immediately following the ceremony.

The naturalization ceremony will be conducted by the Hon. Wallace W. Dixon, U.S. Magistrate with U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina. It is one of the few naturalization proceedings to be held out of a U.S. District Courtroom and the first in the nation to be held on a college campus.

ESCAPE FROM VIETNAM

The naturalization ceremony will culminate a long, hard struggle for 22-year-old Cu Phung. The son of Su Phung and Quoi Nham, both of Chinese extraction, Cu Phung was born in Saigon, Vietnam, on Oct. 20, 1963. The Phung family owned a printing shop which was confiscated when the Communists gained control of Vietnam in 1975.

When Cu was 15, his mother, worried that he might be conscripted into the

Vietnamese army, paid a high price in gold to have her only son smuggled out of the country. He was taken to the coast, where he boarded a 24-meter boat packed with 500 refugees. The boat arrived in Malaysia 15 days later on May 21, 1979, and Cu took up residence in a refugee camp where he witnessed appalling human degradation and suffering.

A year later the Catholic Social Services Program brought Cu to America. John and Diana Moore met him at the CSSP's center in Peoria, IL, and eagerly accepted him as their foster son. Cu suddenly found himself living with a foreign family and attending a foreign school, where, despite the language barrier, he excelled. John Moore, an Army first sergeant, was later transferred to Fort Bragg at Fayetteville, NC. Cu, now a high school graduate, moved with the Moores to Fayetteville and enrolled in Methodist College, a private liberal arts college located on a 600-acre campus on the north edge of the city.

Although the Moore family has since been transferred to Germany, Cu continues his studies at Methodist. A major in chemistry and math with a minor in computer science, Cu has compiled an enviable academic record. He is a member of several student organizations, including his active involvement in Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity.

Cu said he feels proud and fortunate to become a citizen of the United States and has pledged to "serve as a shining light of American patriotism and citizenship."

THE NATURALIZATION CEREMONY

Cu's fraternity brothers at Methodist have been very busy planning the ceremony that will mark his U.S. citizenship. Initial planning for the event began several months ago when the idea was presented to Cu. After convincing him that a ceremony

would be appropriate, the Lambda Chi brothers approached the naturalization officials. Weeks later, when the final approval was granted to hold the event on campus, the fraternity members faced a mad scramble to send out 2,000 invitations; plan a full-scale program with music, speakers and a reception to follow; and alert the media of this unusual and patriotic event.

In order to get the invitations out in time, the fraternity brothers worked until 5 a.m. one morning in the computer/mail room area of the campus. They have also been busy lining up dignitaries for the ceremony, coordinating publicity and 1,001 other details that need to be taken care of before a ceremony of this magnitude can be held.

"It's all worth it, though," said Richard Briggs, vice president of Lambda Chi Alpha. "Cu Phung is a very special person and all the work we're doing is being done on his behalf. We want to make this a very special day for Cuy"

In addition to Judge Dixon, Dr. Elton Hendricks, president of the college, will also be part of the 10 a.m. ceremony on Nov. 15. Also featured will be the Methodist College ROTC Color Guard; Maj. Bruce Daws, commander of Fayetteville Independent Light Infantry; Brig. Gen. Bernard Loeffke, chief of staff, XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg; and Bill Hurley, mayor of Fayetteville.

The principal address will be delivered by Dr. Lynn Sadler, vice president for academic affairs at Methodist. The invocation will be delivered by Dr. Ken Collins, chaplain of the college and an assistant professor of religion, and Bill Lowdermilk, vice president for church/community relations, will offer the benediction.

Also on the program are Dr. Wayne Preslar, professor of English and the advisor to Sigma Theta Zeta chapter of Lambda Chi Alpha; Laura Kernek, a Methodist College music student who will sing the national anthem; and Mrs. Troy C. Merritt and Mrs. Ann Hodges of the Col. Robert Rowan Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

BEN CRAIG TO HIGHLIGHT '86 OUTLOOK SYMPOSIUM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Ben T. Craig, chairman of the board of Northwestern Financial Corporation, will deliver the "Outlook for 1986" address at the Outlook for 1986 Symposium on Tuesday, Nov. 12, at Methodist College.

The symposium, sponsored by the Department of Economics and Business Administration at Methodist, will get underway at 7 p.m. with a reception in the college cafeteria, located in the lower level of the Student Union. The banquet will begin at 7:30 p.m. with the program to follow one-half hour later.

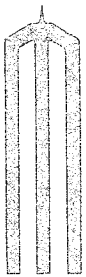

'BACH-B-QUE' AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- The "Big Bach-B-Que Benefit" at Methodist College on Friday, Nov. 15, will kick off the Methodist College Chorus' fundraising efforts for a European tour planned for Spring 1987.

The "Bach-B-Que" will take on a festival atmosphere with an outdoor setting and musical entertainment from three of the college's performance groups -- the Barbershop Quartet, Rainbow's End and the 35-member chorus.

Bar-b-que sandwiches, baked beans, cole slaw, hushpuppies, iced tea, cake and pie will be served on the lawn of Horner Administration Building from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and from 4 to 7 p.m. Tickets for the event are \$3.50 per person. (In case of inclement weather, the "Bach-B-Que" will be held in the Student Union.)

Alan Porter, associate professor of music and director of the chorus, said this is the first time any Methodist College group has undertaken a project of this magnitude. "This is the chorus' big fundraiser and we've had the members busy distributing posters and selling tickets throughout the city of Fayetteville and Cumberland County," said Porter. "We've got a group of students here that are not only talented musicians but outstanding young men and women. They made a commitment to this project and I'm very proud of their initiative and dedication.

"They've set a goal and they know it's going to be difficult raising the money needed to fund this kind of a trip, but I'm confident they'll reach their

goal and the Methodist College chorus will be playing the great cities of Europe in the spring of 1987!"

The group needs to raise approximately \$40,000 to fund the European trip.

The enthusiasm in the music department at Methodist is demonstrated by the success of the Barbershop Quartet and Rainbow's End, two relatively new groups on campus.

Rainbow's End is comprised of five students and was organized last year. The group has performed extensively on and off campus and has received rave reviews. A performance at a Rotary Club meeting last year so moved the Rotarians that they voted to donate \$100 to the group. "That really pleased us," said Porter. "We weren't expecting that kind of response and it really demonstrates the community support that these kids, and for that matter, all the campus groups, get from the Cumberland County area."

The barbershop group was organized informally this fall, making their debut at the annual Miss Methodist College pageant held in early October. Their reception was so overwhelming that they were booked for several performances before they were officially sanctioned as a college group.

The anchor to the success of these groups is the 35-member chorus and, of course, Porter himself. The chorus has become a tradition at Methodist and presents several concerts each year. Community residents, alumni and students look forward to the Homecoming Concert held in front of Hensdale Chapel on the campus mall and the Christmas concert held each December in Reeves Auditorium.

Porter has been "holding the baton" in the Methodist vocal music department since 1963 when he was hired as an assistant professor. He graduated cum laude from Mount Union College in Alliance, OH, with a B.M. degree and he earned his M.M. degree with performance honors from the University of Illinois.

He has been involved with the National Association of Teachers of Singing, Fellowship of United Methodist Musicians, board of directors member to the College/Community Civic Music Association and the American Guild of
