LADY MONARCH GOLFERS TOP-RANKED IN DIVISION III

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Coach Darci Wilson and her Methodist College Lady Monarch golf team will head into the 1986 season as the No. 1 National Collegiate Athletic Assocation (NCAA) Division III team.

The Women's Golf Coaches Association recently released their poll with computerized rankings of 104 teams in all three divisions of the NCAA. Tulsa, a Division I school, headed the list with Troy State the highest ranked Division II team and Methodist (ranked 82nd overall) the top-ranked Division III school.

There were 76 Division I teams and 14 each from Divisions II and III in the coaches' association poll.

Teams ranked below Methodist College included the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, the University of Alabama at Birmingham and Rutgers, all Division I schools, and the University of Wisconsin at Whitewater, a Division III school.

Other Division III schools included in the rankings are Mt. Holyoke, Luther and DePaul. Division II schools that are ranked include Weber State, Longwood, Rollins, the University of California at Sacramento, Air Force and Ferris State, one of only two other schools besides Methodist that offers a degree in professional golf management.

Wilson said that the ranking guarantees Methodist a spot in the prestigious

Small College Nationals golf tournament, which will be held April 11-13 at Echo Farms in Wilmington, NC. "The top six teams in Division II and Division III earn automatic bids to the Small College Nationals," she explained. "Other teams are selected at-large. We're very pleased about the rankings and excited about the upcoming season."

The rankings were based on performances of the fall season. The Lady Monarchs participated in several fall meets. The highlight of the season was their fifth-place showing in the tough Yale Golf Tournament held in early October in New Haven, CT. Thirteen teams participated in the meet, 10 of them from Division I. Methodist placed ahead of six Division I teams — Hartford, UNC-Wilmington, Rutgers, Dartmouth, Boston College and Yale.

Members of the Lady Monarch team are Holly Anderson, Cumberland, ME; Joy Bonhurst, Long Island, NY; Darcy Krumme, Stuart, FL; and Rose Turner, Salisbury, MD. All are freshmen. Lisa Wymer, a sophomore from Culpeper, VA, was a member of the fall squad. An all-conference softball pitcher, she will return to the mound this spring for coach Dan Lawerence and his defending Dixie Conference champions (tournament and regular season).

A collection will be taken after the performance for a memorial to the shuttle victims. There is no admission charge and the play is open to the public.

The theatrical production of "Galileo," a noted astronomer, is just the beginning of Methodist's week-long festival. The large number of events has even drawn the attention of Fayetteville Mayor Bill Hurley, who has proclaimed next week as "Fine Arts Week" in Fayetteville.

Included in this year's festival are plays, recitals, lectures, concerts, photography and art exhibits.

Many of the events are tailored for young people, including an exhibit of young people's art in the lobby of Reeves Auditorium, Feb. 20-22. The exhibit will

MONARCHS RANKED SECOND IN SOUTH REGION;

OPEN SEASON FRIDAY AT ARMSTRONG STATE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Methodist College debuts its 1986 baseball team with a three-day road trip to Savannah, GA, Friday through Sunday, Feb. 28-March 2.

The Monarchs, ranked 12th in the NCAA Division III pre-season poll, will square off against Armstrong State at 2 p.m. on Friday. MC faces Savannah State in a 1 p.m. doubleheader on Saturday, March 1, and on Sunday, March 2, they face Armstrong State again in a 12:30 p.m. game.

Optimism is high in the Monarch camp for the upcoming season. Coach Tom Austin has led his team to the NCAA Division South Region playoffs six consecutive years. His 1986 squad has been ranked second in the region by the NCAA News. States in the South Region are North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Tennessee, Alabama, Louisiana, Maryland, Delaware, Virginia and southern New Jersy.

Methodist is coming off a 32-14 season and is once again favored in the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (DIAC) baseball race. Methodist, North Carolina Wesleyan and Virginia Wesleyan all represented the Dixie in last year's NCAA playoffs.

"Methodist was a young team last year, so most of the starters return this spring," the NCAA News wrote about the team. "Team speed and hitting may be the

top assets for coach Tom Austin."

Among the returnees for MC are Doug Garner and Roy Haddock. They finished eighth and ninth in stolen bases last year among all Division III players with 43 and 40, respectively.

Also back for the Monarchs are sluggers Mark Council (.358), Stan Mozingo (.353), Danny Hartline (.366) and Jansen Evans (.365).

In the exhibition season recently completed, Methodist beat UNC-Chapel Hill, tied Duke University and downed Mount Olive College, 12-2. Hartline hit a grand slam home run in the Mount Olive game.

Methodist opens its home season on Monday, March 3, with a 3 p.m. contest against Catholic University of Washington, D.C. That game will played at Shelley Field on the Methodist College campus.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Three members of the Methodist College women's basketball team have been named to the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (DIAC) teams.

TOWNSEND NAMED FIRST-TEAM ALL-DIXIE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Monarch basketball standout Lee Townsend has been named to the 1986 Dixie All-Conference First Team. Townsend, a junior from Fairmont, NC, was one of five first-team selections. He led the conference scoring derby for most of the season and finished with a 22.6 average, just behind UNC-G's Robert Bryant (also a first-team pick), who led the league in scoring with a 24.5 per game clip.

Townsend was among the nation's scoring leaders in Division III throughout the 1985-86 season.

A dominant force on both offense and defense, the 6-2, 192 lb. forward was especially tough under the basket. Game after game he faced the league's dominant centers but when the final stats were counted, Townsend emerged the conference rebounding king -- a position he held throughout the season.

In 25 regular season and conference games he pulled down an impressive 242 caroms for a per game average of 9.7. His nearest challengers were Greensboro College's Gene Corbett and Christopher Newport's Joel Fortune, each with 7.8 per game.

For the season, Townsend also ranked among the conference leaders in field goal and free throw shooting. He connected on 216 of 432 shots for an even 50

percent from the field and from the charity stripe he was a solid 70 percent, 132 of 188.

Townsend was also chosen the DIAC "Player of the Week" for his performance in the last week of regular season competition. According to the conference SID, he was cited for averaging "26.3 points, including a high of 41 against Averett, in three games. (He) also hit on 30 of 40 tries from the floor and averaged 9.7 rebounds."

Methodist closed the season in seventh place in the Dixie with a 4-10 mark. MC was eliminated from the conference tournament with an opening round loss to eventual tourney champion Christoper Newport, 72-60, at Newport News, VA. That loss ended the Monarchs' season at 5-21.
