MCCREE BRYAN NAMED TO HISTORIAN POST AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Mary Lynn McCree Bryan of Fayetteville has been named historian-in-residence at Methodist College by Dr. Lynn Veach Sadler, vice president for academic affairs and academic dean.

McCree Bryan, a nationally known expert on Jane Addams, will serve as a resource person in the college's history department. Her appointment becomes effective at the beginning of the 1986-87 academic year.

McCree Bryan holds a bachelor of arts degree in history from Alabama Polytechnic Institute and a master of arts degree in history from the University of Illinois. In 1975, she received an M.B.A. from the University of Chicago.

Since 1983, McCree Bryan has been editor of <u>The Jane Addams Papers</u> at Duke University. She previously held several positions at the University of Illinois at Chicago library, including head of the manuscripts collection, curator of Jane Addams Hull-House, and acting university librarian. From 1975-83, McCree Bryan edited <u>The Jane Addams Papers</u> at Illinois-Chicago.

She has presented lectures to historical organizations throughout the nation, most notably Society of American Archivists, Organization of American Historians,

Case Western Advanced Archival Program, American Association for State and Local (more)

History, National Association of State Archivists and Records Administrators,
Berkshire Conference, Midwest Archives Conference, Chicago Area Historians and
other Chicago and Midwestern historical groups.

McCree Bryan was invited to make a presentation at Toynbee Hall in London in 1979.

Locally, she has made presentations to the North Carolina Special Librarians Association in 1983, to the Society of North Carolina Archivists in 1984 and at Pembroke State University in Pembroke, NC, in 1985.

She has edited and written for numerous publications on the life of Jane Addams, including <u>Guide to the Papers of Jane Addams</u> and <u>Eighty Years at Hull-House</u>. She has co-edited <u>Prairie State</u>, <u>Impressions of Illinois</u>, 1673-1967 and has contributed to <u>Archival and Manuscript Resources for the Study of Women's History</u>; A Beginning.

McCree Bryan serves as a board member of the Friends of North Carolina Archives, in addition to positions on the Cumberland County Community Foundation Board of Directors and the Historic Fayetteville Foundation.

She previously held positions with the National Historical Publications and Records Commission, the Society of American Archivists, the Illinois State Historical Records Advisory Board and the Northern Illinois University Regional Archives Advisory Board.





FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Two members of the Methodist College faculty began study this week at the prestigious National Endowment for the Humanities Summer Seminars for College Teachers at Harvard University.

Elaine Porter, associate professor of French, is participating in a French classical literature seminar and Jane Weeks Townsend, instructor of music, is studying 19th century Afro-American musicians.

The NEH seminars are highly competitive and held annually on the campuses of America's leading research institutions. For a small liberal arts college like Methodist to have two selections to the seminars exemplifies the growing prominence of its academic programs. Porter will be working under Jules Brody, a romance language professor at Harvard. Eileen Southern, also from Harvard, will direct Townsend's seminar.

Beyond the work of the group, each participant undertakes an individual research project or program of intensive reading under the guidance of the director. Townsend is studying classical composition forms as they were approached by the 19th century Afro-American composers. Porter's study project is Charles Perrault.

The two women will conclude their study at Harvard on August 15.
