# Poet Laureate To Record For Posterity

North Carolinians across the state will soon be able to hear their poet laureate, Sam(uel) Talmadge Ragan, reading his own poetry. This special privilege has been made possible by the Friends of Davis Memorial Library of Methodist College, a not-yet two-year-old, but energetic and dynamic, organization.

The idea was born at the charter meeting of the Friends in October 1984, when the assembled members listened spellbound as Ragan read from his poetry, including selections from "The Tree in the Far Pasture," "Journey into Morning," and, "To the Water's Edge." Many of the state's citizens have encountered Ragan during his 40-plus years of service in promoting cultural and artistic activities, either through his newspaper editorials, television commentaries, or in his leadership roles in such organizations as the N.C. Department of Cultural Resources, Weymouth Center, N.C. Writers Forum, Writer's Workshop, and many others too numerous to list. But, most have not had the pleasure of experiencing the warmth and beauty of Ragan's voice while reading his own poetry.

Ragan's permission was obtained for the Friends to seek a grant to have a recording made. The purpose of the grant was to make a professional recording of North Carolina's poet laureate reading his own poetry. The recordings would be distributed free of charge to 1000 libraries in North Carolina (public school, community college, university and college, and public) for use in classrooms and discussion groups or for personal enjoyment. The object was not only to capture 70-year-old Sam Ragan's voice for posterity but also to make North Carolinians aware of and develop an appreciation for their literary heritage. By placing the recordings in multitype libraries, every citizen of the state would have an opportunity to personally hear NC's poet laureate, both now and in future years. With the new emphasis on North Carolina history (which includes literary history) in the public school system, it was believed that this recording would be well used in classrooms throughout the state.

Several major recording companies were contacted and almost immediately a telephone call was received from Dr. Arthur (Luce) Klein, president of Spoken Arts Recording Company of New York. Dr. Klein was interested and enthusiastic about recording Sam Ragan and sent the Friends a proposal. Spoken Arts, in 1956, had recorded another North Carolina writer, Paul Green, and had only recently completed a nine-year project of recording 100 modern American poets. Dr. Klein was intrigued by the Friends' project and volunteered to come to Fayetteville and conduct the Ragan recording session

Grant applications were submitted to several foundations and positive, responses from three, North Carolina Arts Council, Josephus Daniels Charitable Foundation and the John Wesley and Anna Hodgin Hanes Foundation, insured the success of the project.

Dr. Klein and Mr. Ragan met in Fayetteville soon after and the recording project was set in motion. A tape made at Daxwood Studio was turned over to one of New York's best editing firms to prepare a master disk. The record jacket, which will carry a portrait of Sam Ragan, will be designed by the Spoken Arts design department. The linear notes and reviews are in the capable hands of Paul Kresh of the New York Times, a 1980 Emmy Award winner.

The Friends of Davis Memorial Library are currently planning a presentation ceremony at which Mr. Ragan williautograph copies of the recording to be given to representatives of the multitype libraries who are the primary beneficiaries of the project. Although the recording will later become available for purchase through Spoken Arts of New York, it is the dream of the Friends to seek additional grant funds to distribute the recording nationwide so that poetry lovers throughout America can also enjoy NC's poet laureate.

Ragan joins a distinguished group of American writers, playwrights and poets whose work, as read by themselves, have been preserved for the enrichment of the nation's cultural heritage. In such an undertaking North Carolina occupies a most prominent position. It is a matter in which all North Carolinians may take great pride.


