LADY MONARCHS QUALIFY FOR NATIONAL TOURNEY

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Methodist College has received a bid to the NCAA Division III women's soccer national tournament. The Lady Monarchs will play on Saturday, Nov. 8, in the West Regional at the University of California at San Diego.

Methodist will face St. Mary's College of Winona, MN, at a time yet to be determined on Saturday. The winner of the that contest will face UC-San Diego on Sunday. The West Regional winner will advance to the national tournament at a site to be determined along with winners of the New England, Northeast and South/Mideast regions.

The Lady Monarchs, coached by Joe Pereira, recently won their second consecutive Dixie Conference championship with a 4-0 record. They are 13-4-1 for the season.

The team is led by Brenda McKimens (Jr., Fairfax, VA) with nine goals and eight assists (26 points); Michelle Quinones (Jr., Arlington, VA), nine goals, six assists (24 points); Lisa Milligan (sophomore, Philadelphia, PA), nine goals, five assists (23 points); Lori Silvasy (Jr., Fairfax, VA), five goals, eight assists (18 points); Donna Decker (Fr., Woodbridge, VA), five goals, five assists (15 points); and Jill Starke (Jr., Malvern, PA), five goals, two assists (12 points).

Goalkeeper Teresa Estes (Soph., Dunwoody, GA) has had 146 shots on goal, 73 (more)

saves, nine shutouts and allowed 17 goals in 18 games for a .94 game per goal average.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Dr. Digby Anderson, a columnist for the <u>Times</u> of London, will lecture on Wednesday, Nov. 5, at Methodist College. Anderson will lecture on "Breaking the Spell of the Welfare State" at 5 p.m. in the Trustees' Building on the Methodist Campus.

He will present the same lecture at 1 p.m. in Room 107 of the Trustees' Building. At 2 p.m., he will present "Bad Schools: The Need for Reform in British Education" in Room 209 of the Trustees' Building. The lectures are open to the public at no charge.

Anderson, who is also a columnist for the <u>Spectator</u> and has published in the <u>Guardian</u> and <u>Wall Street Journal</u>, holds a doctorate in sociology from Brunel University. He is director of the Social Affairs Unit in London, an independent think tank in social policy.


'A NIGHT OF THE ARTS'


