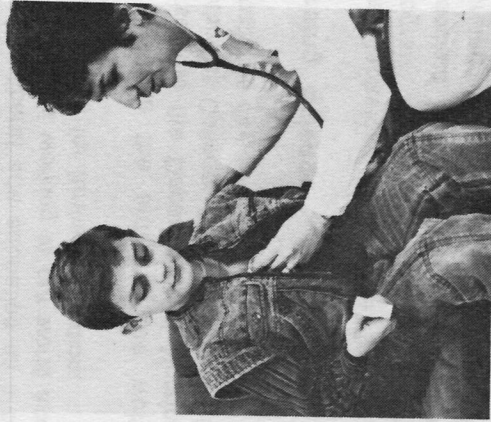

5. Show a valid North Carolina State license to practice professional nursing
6. Submit yearly evidence of current professional liability insurance to the Department of Nursing.

Mary Underwood, the new director of Methodist's Evening College, will double as site director at Pope until the extension program enrolls 75 students, at which time a full-time site director will be employed.

^{For} ~~During~~ the last ^{three} ~~two~~ years, Ms. Underwood ~~has~~ directed a junior college extension program at Pope for Central Texas College. A Charlotte native, she holds a bachelor's degree in English from UNC-Charlotte and a master's degree in English education from Auburn University.

Methodist's Pope branch will follow the "accelerated semester" schedule--in which a semester's work is compressed into nine weeks. The college will initially offer at Pope all the classes needed to earn bachelor's degrees in psychology and business.

~~Fourteen~~ ^{Fourteen} classes will be offered during Term I-- August-October, 1987 -- at the Pope Education Center. The lineup includes beginning courses in business, psychology, history, religion, math, and accounting. Classes will be offered during lunch hours Monday-Friday, at night (either in Monday ~~and~~ Wednesday or Tuesday ~~and~~ Thursday combinations), and on Saturday mornings.

"We will offer complete student services at Pope," said Ms. Underwood, "to include counseling, registration, and textbooks. We are pleased to have this opportunity to better serve the military community at Pope."

MEDICAL SOCIETY AUXILARY ENDOWS NURSING SCHOLARSHIP AT METHODIST

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- The Cumberland County Medical Society Auxilary has established the Merle Rainey Memorial Nursing Scholarship at Methodist College.

Dr. Ann Harley, director of Methodist's Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, said the \$600 annual scholarship will be awarded for the first time this fall. She said a scholarship committee of the sponsoring organization will select the recipient.

Any nursing student who has completed 12 semester hours at Methodist with a grade point average of 3.00 (B) or better is eligible to apply. Scholarship winners will be chosen on the basis of scholastic excellence, financial need, potential for success and contribution to nursing, and character (including personality and ambition).

Methodist will award Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.) degrees to six persons August 25. They are the first to receive degrees under Methodist's two-year completion program, a program designed for graduates of associate degree or diploma schools who wish to earn their baccalaureate degrees.

METHODIST COLLEGE PREPARES FOR FALL OPENING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Methodist College will begin its 28th academic year next week.

Evening College classes begin Monday, Aug. 24. Day classes start Thursday, Aug. 27. Registration will be held all day Wednesday for the day program.

The dorms will open to new freshman and transfer students Sunday, Aug. 23. A dinner for all new students, both resident and commuting, is slated for 5 p.m. Sunday in the Main Dining Room. Continuing resident students will return Tuesday, Aug. 25.

College officials are projecting a fall enrollment of 1,300 students-- 850 in the day program and 450 in the evening program. Approximately 405 students will be living on campus, the largest number in 17 years.

Several improvements were made to college facilities during the summer. A new fountain was built on the main quadrangle. The Computer Science Lab was refitted with new microcomputers. A psychology lab, with five microcomputers and biofeedback equipment, was added.

Construction began this week on eight new tennis courts, on a site adjacent to the softball field behind Cumberland Hall. The six existing tennis courts, located southwest of Cumberland on the site of the proposed Physical Activities Center, will be used until construction begins on the new building.

New administrators at the college include: Michael Safley, vice president for student affairs; John Keso, director of financial aid; and Mary Underwood, director of the Evening College program at the main campus and Pope Air Force Base.

New members of the Methodist College faculty include: Dr. John Michael Marr, director of the Reeves School of Business and professor of business administration; Dr. Allen Hope, assistant professor of physical education and head tennis coach for men and women; Dr. James X. Ward, assistant
