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





METHODIST COLLEGE PREPARES FOR FALL OPENING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Methodist College will begin its 28th academic year next week.

Evening College classes begin Monday, Aug. 24. Day classes start Thursday, Aug. 27. Registration will be held all day Wednesday for the day program.

The dorms will open to new freshman and transfer students Sunday, Aug. 23. A dinner for all new students, both resident and commuting, is slated for 5 p.m. Sunday in the Main Dining Room. Continuing resident students will return Tuesday, Aug. 25.

College officials are projecting a fall enrollment of 1,300 students—850 in the day program and 450 in the evening program. Approximately 405 students will be living on campus, the largest number in 17 years.

Several improvements were made to college facilities during the summer.

A new fountain was built on the main quadrangle. The Computer Science Lab
was refitted with new microcomputers. A psychology lab, with five microcomputers
and biofeedback equipment, was added.

Construction began this week on eight new tennis courts, on a site adjacent to the softball field behind Cumberland Hall. The six existing tennis courts, located southwest of Cumberland on the site of the proposed Physical Activities Center, will be used until construction begins on the new building.

New administrators at the college include: Michael Safley, vice president for student affairs; John Keso, director of financial aid; and Mary Underwood, director of the Evening College program at the main campus and Pope Air Force Base.
