
PRESIDENT HENDRICKS, OSBORNE, AND ZIMMER INDUCTED INTO ODK AT METHODIST







METHODIST COLLEGE AWARDS 100 DEGREES AT 16TH WINTER COMMENCEMENT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College awarded 100 degrees to 96 persons at its 16th winter commencement Dec. 15.

John G. Dicks III, a lawyer and legislator from Chesterfield, VA, urged members of the graduating class to cherish the values and friendships acquired at Methodist and to accept fully the responsibilities of citizenship. Dicks is a 1973 graduate of Methodist and a member of the Virginia House of Delegates.

"America's challenges are too great and too complex and too compelling for any of us to say 'It's someone else's responsibility,'" he stated. "As graduates of this exceptional institution, you're well equipped. For the cause of peace, for the success of commerce, and for the future of democracy, the implications are astronomical. 


