


METHODIST COLLEGE CHORUS TO GIVE CONCERT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--U.S. Senator Terry Sanford will deliver the commencement address at Methodist College Sunday, May 7. The college's 26th spring commencement will be held at 2 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium.

Senator Sanford served as the first chairman of the board of trustees at Methodist and still serves on the board. He will be joining members of the first graduating class - the Class of 1964 - for a 25th anniversary reunion. Members of that class will attend a luncheon and march with the newest graduates. Betty Neill Guy Parsons '64, choral music teacher at Cape Fear High School, will sing a soprano solo during the commencement program.
