METHODIST COLLEGE TO STAGE "OKLAHOMA!"

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Methodist College Theatre Department will present the Rogers and Hammerstein musical "Oklahoma!" July 27, 28, and 29 in O'Hanlon Amphitheater on the college campus.

Show times are 8 p.m. Tickets are \$6 for adults and \$4 for children.

Betty M. Dunn, a drama teacher from Northeastern High School in Elizabeth City, is guest director. Brenda Byrd is the music director and Robin Westbrook is the choreographer. S. Matthew Enerson is the technical and lighting director.

The "Oklahoma!" cast numbers 20 and includes high school students and young adults from throughout the Cape Fear region. Area residents playing principal roles include: from Fayetteville — Barbara Martin as Aunt Eller, William McMillan as Fred, Chris Patterson as Jud Fry, Wendy Powers as Ado Annie Carnes; from Hope Mills — LeAnna Croom as Laurey, Kevin Luck as Will Parker; from neighboring communities — Troy Rudeseal of Sanford as Curly, Floyd Benfield, Jr. of Erwin as Andrew Carnes, and Mark Reynolds of Fort Bragg as Ali Hakim.

"I feel fortunate to have a cast of this quality for a summer production," said Mrs. Dunn, the show's director. "Several high school and college age cast members have attended Governor's School. They are all talented and enthusiastic."

Mrs. Dunn is currently enrolled in summer school at Methodist, working on a teaching endorsement in theatre arts. She has 20 years experience as a high school English, drama, and speech/debate teacher. She directed a high school production of "Oklahoma!" nine years ago.

The Rogers and Hammerstein musical "Oklahoma!" opened on Broadway in 1943 and was revived in 1979-80. It is the 12th longest running show in Broadway history. In 1955, a movie version was released, starring Gordon MacRae, Gloria Grahame, Gene Nelson, Charlotte Greenwood, James Whitmore, and Shirley Jones.

"Oklahoma!" has been described as "a masterpiece of the American musical theatre." Memorable songs from the show include: "Oh, What a Beautiful Mornin',"

"The Surrey With the Fringe On Top," "People Will Say We're In Love," and "Oklahoma."
