FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Denise Guidotti, a 1989 graduate of Methodist College, has received a grant from the American Translators Association to translate three letters written by the French patriot Lafayette.

The letters were found in the archives of Metz, France and copies were forwarded to Martha Duell, president of Fayetteville's Lafayette Society. Mrs. Duell will present copies of the letters to the Lafayette Collection in Davis Memorial Library. In the letters (all written in the 1780's and 1790's), Lafayette describes his feelings of insecurity during the French Revolution and his love for the newly formed United States of America.

Ms. Guidotti, who graduated with honors in French, was encouraged to undertake the translation project by Mrs. Elaine Porter, associate professor of French at Methodist. Once completed, the translated letters and copies of the original French manuscripts will become part of the Lafayette Collection in Methodist's Davis Memorial Library.

METHODIST COLLEGE TO OBSERVE HOMECOMING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Raccoon coats and flapper dresses will be back in style as Methodist College celebrates "The Roaring Twenties" during Homecoming Weekend, Oct. 27-29.

This homecoming will be unique in several respects. For the first time ever, campus organizations have selected both male and female representatives to the Homecoming Court. A king and queen will be crowned during halftime of the Methodist vs. Maryville football game Saturday, Oct. 28.

A variety of sporting events is scheduled for Saturday—a men's soccer game, the football game, and a women's soccer game. Methodist is hosting the Dixie Conference Men's Soccer Championships Saturday and Sunday. (See enclosed schedule.)

The Student Government Association and the Methodist College Alumni Association have planned a wide range of activities for current students and alumni. Preliminaries will begin Wednesday, Oct. 25 with Charleston lessons, introduction of the homecoming contestants, and Casino Night followed by a Charleston contest. On Thursday evening, Jeff Dunham and Peanut (a ventriloquist act) will appear in the Student Union.

The Student Activities Council will sponsor a treasure hunt for a replica of Al Capone's vault that has been hidden on campus. Clues and a map will be handed out from various locations beginning Wednesday. The first team to find the vault will win prizes worth \$50-\$75.

On Friday morning, the student body and cheerleaders will gather for a pep rally in the Student Union. Members of the fall teams competing during Homecoming Weekend--football, men's soccer, women's soccer-will be introduced. A bonfire and second pep rally are slated for Friday night in O'Hanlon Amphitheater.

Saturday morning activities include: a carnival on the campus mall, a tour of the new Physical Activities Center, and a men's soccer game featuring Methodist vs. Christopher Newport (opening round of the Dixie Conference Tournament).

Afternoon activities include: a pre-game parade of homecoming contestants led by the Cary High School Marching Band, the Methodist vs. Maryville (TN) College football game (with halftime entertainment by the Cary Band), and a women's soccer game against Queens College.

Evening activities include: a reception for alumni in the Mallett-Rogers House, an alumni dinner, and a homecoming dance at the Holiday Inn.

Homecoming festivities conclude with two events Sunday—a worship service in Hensdale Chapel led by the Rev. Jack Hunter '64 and a library lecture by Parker Wilson entitled "The legacy of Lafayette."




METHODIST COLLEGE CHORUS TO HOLD "BAHAMA-QUE"


