HYLER, NEWTON TO DISCUSS ECONOMIC OUTLOOK FOR 1990

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--James B. Hyler, Jr., president of First Citizens BancShares, Inc. and First Citizens Bank and Trust Co., will deliver the keynote address at the 16th Annual Economic Outlook Symposium Wednesday, November 15 at Methodist College.

Is America's longest peacetime economic expansion coming to a close? "Mr. Hyler is in a good position to answer this question and tell us what to expect in 1990," noted Dr. Sid Gautam, economics professor at Methodist.

James Hyler is a graduate of Virginia Polytechnic Institute, where he received a degree in accounting. He is a member of the Financial Executives Institute, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and the North Carolina Association of Certified Public Accountants.

METHODIST COLLEGE TEACHER, CUMBERLAND COUNTY TEACHER TO COLLABORATE ON
TEACHER-TRAINING PROJECT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Two local educators -- Mrs. Elaine Porter of Methodist College and Mrs. Georgia Grant of the Cumberland County Schools -- are participating in a federally-funded project to improve the training of elementary school foreign language teachers.

Mrs. Porter is associate professor of French at Methodist College and Mrs. Grant is a certified K-12 French specialist who teaches at J. W. Coon, Sherwood Park, and Rockfish elementary schools in Cumberland County. Over the next 30 months, Mrs. Porter and Mrs. Grant will work with 11 other teams of college/public school teachers in North Carolina to develop an effective methods course curriculum for training future elementary school foreign language teachers. By 1993, all public school kindergarten and elementary students in North Carolina will be required to study a foreign language.

The teacher training project is being conducted by the Center for Applied Linguistics and the N.C. Dept. of Public Instruction from Nov. 1, 1989-May, 1992. The project was funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Education's Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education.

Phase I of the project takes place Nov. 4-7, when the 24 participants attend a four-day seminar in Winston-Salem on teacher training methods. Leading foreign language educators will discuss language acquisition and child development.

In subsequent phases of the project, Mrs. Porter and other teacher educators will: observe elementary foreign language teachers in their classrooms, co-teach with elementary language teachers, and collaborate with experienced teachers in the development of a "model" curriculum for training elementary school foreign language teachers.

Current plans call for the project to be repeated after 1992 with a second group of North Carolina teacher training institutions. The teacher education curriculum and training model developed over the next 30 months will be made available to all interested school districts by the Center for Applied Linguistics and the N. C. Department of Public Instruction.

BASS-BARITONE TO GIVE RECITAL OF AFRO-AMERICAN MUSIC AT METHODIST COLLEGE

Fayetteville, NC--Dr. Oral Moses, assistant professor of music at Kennesaw State College in Marietta, GA, will give a free concert Tuesday, Nov. 14 at Methodist College.

The bass-baritone will perform "Songs of Afro-American Composers" at 8 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium. He will be accompanied by Jane Weeks Gardiner, pianist.

A South Carolina native, Dr. Moses received a Bachelor of Music degree from Fiske University. He holds the Master of Music and Director of Musical Arts degrees from the University of Michigan. He has researched and written about black American composers of the 19th century.

He has studied in Austria and West Germany and performed widely throughout western Europe. In 1983, Dr. Moses toured five countries in western Europe, singing the role of "Porgy" in the concert version of Porgy and Bess.

Dr. Moses will teach a voice master class for music students at Methodist Nov. 13. His appearances in Fayetteville are supported by the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County with a grant from the Grassroots Arts Program of the N.C. Arts Council.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--"The Liberty Meeting, Being a Play of Fayetteville," a 10-minute bicentennial skit by S. P. Miles, will be performed three times Wednesday, Nov. 22 outside First Presbyterian Church on Bow Street. Show times are 7:00, 7:10, and 7:20 p.m.

The setting is Liberty Point Tavern in Fayetteville Nov. 24, 1789 -- two days after a North Carolina delegation ratified the U.S. Constitution. The cast, made up of Methodist College faculty and students, includes: Daniel Covell as William Barry Grove, Robert Bloodworth as John Hay, Paul Wilson as James Moore, John Sill as John Ingram, Parker Wilson as Capt. 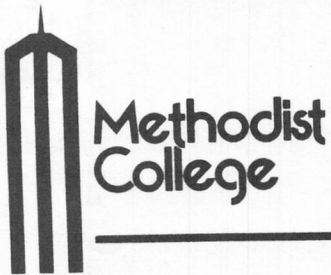

FIRST CITIZENS BANK PRESIDENT PREDICTS ECONOMIC SLOWDOWN

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--After seven consecutive years of economic expansion, the U.S. economy will experience slow growth in 1990, predicts First Citizens Bank President James B. Hyler Jr.

Speaking at Methodist College's 16th annual Economic Outlook Symposium Nov. 15, Hyler predicted a 2 percent increase in the GNP and a prime lending rate of 9-9½ percent by the end of next year. "I expect the overall inflation level to be around 4 percent," he added.

Hyler also predicted that the North Carolina economy would fare better than the national economy. He described "the education problem"--a high illiteracy rate and low per-pupil expenditures on secondary education--as the single most important issue facing the state. "If we do not face these problems," he said, "the state's pool of qualified labor will continue to shrink and this will have a devastating effect on our economic development and growth."

The banking executive said people in the business community must get involved in education and "work to make schools, teachers and students more accountable for their successes and failures by applying the types of standards that we in business use everyday."
