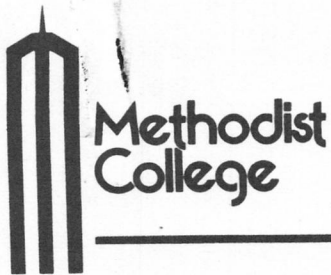

CENTER FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP TO GIVE AWARDS AT STOCK MARKET SYMPOSIUM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Center for Entrepreneurship at Methodist College is now accepting nominations for three awards to be given at its ninth annual Stock Market Symposium Thursday, April 19.

An "Outstanding Woman Entrepreneur of the Year" award will be made to a North Carolina resident who owns, has established, or manages a small business. The Award Committee will consider the individual's creativeness, innovativeness, and personal contributions to and involvement with the community.

A "Small Business Excellence Award" will be made to an outstanding small business employing fewer than 500 persons with annual revenues of less than \$15 million. The Award Committee will consider the creativity of the business, the uniqueness of the product, the employees' welfare, and the contributions of the business to its community.

The Silver Spoon Award, traditionally given at the Stock Market Symposium, will be continued. This award is given to a person who, "though not born with the proverbial silver spoon in his/her mouth, has originated and built a successful business recognized for its uniqueness in planning, production, or some other aspect of its operation."

March 31 is the deadline for submitting nominations for any of the three awards. Persons wishing to make nominations should submit official forms (available from Dr. Sid Gautam) and supporting material to the Center for Entrepreneurship, Methodist College, 5400 Ramsey Street, Fayetteville, NC 28311.

METHODIST CHEERLEADERS WIN CONFERENCE TITLE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Methodist College cheerleaders took First Place honors in the Dixie Conference Cheerleading Championship Feb. 24.

Cheerleading squads from Greensboro College, NC Wesleyan College, Christopher Newport College and Methodist competed in Methodist's new March F. Riddle Center. Each squad performed a five-minute routine which included two cheers, two chants, and one dance.

A three-judge panel judged the squads on degree of difficulty, appearance, voice projection, spirit/originality, and precision of movement/rhythm. The Methodist squad received the highest score and a trophy. The Greensboro College cheerleaders came in second.

Tricia Turner, coach of the Methodist squad, said she was proud of the four-member group or "quad" as they dubbed themselves. "Their routine was 'awesome,'" she said. "Long hours of practice paid off. They deserved to win."

The judges awarded the Methodist squad 44 points, only four short of a perfect score. This marks the first time since 1985 that a Methodist cheerleading squad has won First Place in the conference tournament.

The Methodist cheerleaders who competed are: Kim Rueda, a junior from Fayetteville; Joan Meade, a sophomore from Clarkton, NC; A. J. Jones, a freshman from Greensboro, NC; and Dearn Priester, a junior from Boston, MA.

FORT BRAGG PLAYHOUSE, METHODIST COLLEGE TO PRESENT "TIME OF DRUMS," AN ADAPTATION OF THE JOHN EHLE NOVEL

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Fort Bragg Playhouse, in association with Methodist College, will present John Ehle's "Time of Drums" March 23-25 and March 30-April 1.

Lee Yopp, artistic director of the Fort Bragg Playhouse, adapted Ehle's novel for the stage. Published in 1970, "Time of Drums" tells the story of two brothers divided by the Civil War and their love for the same woman.

Methodist College commissioned Yopp to write and direct the play for its ninth annual Southern Writers' Symposium (March 23-24) honoring Asheville native John Ehle. Yopp consulted with Ehle at various stages while writing the script.

The production will feature Fayetteville actors Robert Bloodworth (Confederate Col. Owen Wright), Leonard McLeod (Papa), and Pat Reese (General Manger). Other principal players are Michael Melcher from Southern Pines (Woofer Wright), Margaret Jemison from New York (Sory), and Shannon Bailey from Raleigh (Nell Wright).

"Time of Drums" will be staged at the Fort Bragg Playhouse March 23, 24, 30 and April 1 at 8:15 p.m. and March 25 and April 1 at 2:15 p.m. Tickets are \$8 for the evening performances and \$6 for the Sunday matinees. Soldiers E-4 and below with one guest will be admitted at half price. Senior citizens receive a \$1 discount and group discounts are available.

METHODIST COLLEGE CONCLUDES \$3.8 MILLION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College received a \$250,000 challenge grant from the Kresge Foundation March 19, concluding a three-year capital campaign for funds to build a physical activities center.

In February, 1989, the Kresge Foundation awarded Methodist a \$250,000 challenge grant, contingent on the college raising an additional \$541,501 needed to meet a campaign goal of \$3,809,513. The college was given until March 1, 1990 to meet the Kresge challenge.

The college reached its campaign goal and qualified for the Kresge grant the last week in February, 1990. "We have now concluded the most successful fund drive in the history of Methodist College," said Dr. M. Elton Hendricks, college president. "We are deeply grateful to the 1,202 contributors who made our new physical activities center possible."

Named the March F. Riddle Center, the new physical education building was completed and occupied Jan. 18. The facility totals 46,600 square feet and includes a 1,200 seat gymnasium, locker rooms for men, women, and staff; a training room; a conference room; two classrooms; a handball court; a dance studio; and offices for the athletic staff and coaches.

Several major events have already been held in the Riddle Center. The Dixie Conference Basketball Tournament was played there Feb. 21-24. A handbell festival was held there March 3-4.

NEBRASKA EDUCATOR NAMED DEAN AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Dr. Erik J. Bitterbaum, a Nebraska educator, will become vice president for academic affairs at Methodist College effective July 1. He succeeds Dr. Lynn V. Sadler, who resigned in January to become president of Johnson State College in Vermont.

College President Elton Hendricks announced the appointment March 27. Dr. Bitterbaum is currently serving as associate provost at Nebraska Wesleyan University in Lincoln, NE. NWU is a United Methodist liberal arts college with an enrollment of 1,600 students.

Dr. Bitterbaum is an ornithologist, a poet, and a world traveler. The New York native received his bachelor's and master's degrees in zoology from Occidental College in Los Angeles, CA and a Ph.D. in zoology from the University of Florida. During his nine years at Nebraska Wesleyan, Dr. Bitterbaum has served as associate provost, assistant provost for lifelong learning, and assistant professor of biology.

"For a man his age Dr. Bitterbaum has had extensive academic and administrative experiences," said President Hendricks. "He will be a source of fresh and creative ideas. He relates well to a wide range of people. We are fortunate to attract a man of his talents."

Dr. Bitterbaum was one of three finalists to be interviewed for the post of academic dean. He visited the Methodist College campus March 11-12. "I was very

impressed with the campus, administrative staff, and faculty," he said. "I was also attracted by the fact that Methodist is a young institution with tremendous potential."

The college's new academic dean is 37 years old and is married to an audiologist. He has published extensively in the field of ornithology and has written numerous poems about his field experiences in Mexico, Southern California, and the West Indies.

Dr. Bitterbaum expressed "a compelling interest in the challenge to maintain quality in liberal arts education."
