METHODIST ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR SUMMER SEMESTER

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Registration opens April 17 for the summer semester at Methodist College. A total of 145 courses will be offered during five different terms.

<u>Daytime</u> courses will be offered during three different terms -- Term I: May 7-June 12; Term II: June 19-July 18; and Term III: July 19-Aug. 16. Classes will meet every weekday during each term.

WAL-MART FOUNDATION AWARDS FELLOWSHIP TO METHODIST CCLLEGE PROFESSOR

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Wal-Mart Foundation, based in Springfield, MO, has awarded a Free Enterprise Fellowship to Dr. Donald Kline, professor of business and economics at Methodist College.

The \$1,000 stipend will support the establishment of a Students In Free Enterprise Chapter at Methodist during the 1990-91 academic year. Dr. Kline filed the application for the college to become affiliated with the SIFE program. A specialist in business management, Dr. Kline holds a B.S. degree from Wayne State University, an M.B.A. from New York University, and a Ph.D. from Syracuse University.

The stated purpose of the Wal-Mart Foundation's Students In Free Enterprise program is "to bring America's collegians and her citizens to a better understanding of and a greater appreciation for the free enterprise system." In the words of the Foundation, "This is acomplished through SIFE teams' outreach projects within their communities and the presentation of these projects at the regional and national competitions."

Methodist is one of 50 American colleges approved for membership in the SIFE program in 1990-91. A total of 252 colleges now have SIFE chapters.

Dr. Kline will recruit chapter members among students enrolled in the Reeves School of Business. He will also serve as chapter adviser and conduct training sessions in preparation for a major outreach project in the Cumberland County business community. The project developed at Methodist's SIFE chapter will be entered in a regional competition in April 1991.

The business professor said the Students In Free Enterprise chapter is the logical successor to the Economics and Business Club which currently exists on campus. He said students who join and participate in the development of next year's SIFE outreach program will receive 3 semester hours of academic credit for Business 345 - "Field Experience in Economics and Business."



LEGISLATIVE CANDIDATES FORUM SLATED FOR METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College will host a Candidates Forum Wednesday, April 25 at 7 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium. The public is invited.

Candidates running locally for seats in the N. C. House and Senate will be present to answer questions posed by the sponsors, a panel, and members of the audience. The forum is being co-sponsored by the Methodist College History and Political Science Club, the Fayetteville Area Chamber of Commerce, the local Sierra Club, and the Junior League of Fayetteville. WFNC Radio (640 AM) will broadcast the forum live.

Keith Gardiner, president of the Braxton-Bragg chapter of the AUSA, will serve as moderator for the forum. Panelists will include: Frankie Atkins, president of the Methodist College History and Political Science Club; Mark Stinneford, state government reporter for The Fayetteville Observer; Paul Andrew Dawkins, editor of Expressions magazine; and Greg Barnes, Fayetteville Bureau Chief for WTVD-11.

In the May 8 Democratic primary, Cumberland County voters will nominate two of four candidates vying for House seats in the 17th District and three of eight candidates seeking seats in the 18th District. Four persons are seeking the Democratic nomination for two Senate seats in the 12th Senate District. There is no Republican primary.

All of the Democratic candidates have accepted invitations to appear at the forum. Candidates will face questions about a wide range of legislative issues,

such as: state revenue shortfalls and prospects for a state lottery, continued funding of the Basic Education Plan for the state's public schools, rising crime rates, prison overcrowding, siting of a nuclear waste dump, highway funding, and improvements to state parks.

The forum is scheduled to end at 9 p.m. A public reception will be held immediately following the forum in the Reeves lobby to give local residents the opportunity to meet the candidates.


