METHODIST COLLEGE ANNOUNCES SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College has awarded \$355,600 in Incentive Scholarships to 101 applicants for the 1990-91 freshman class.

Director of Admissions Fiore Bergamasco announced April 20 that eight students had been awarded maximum Incentive Scholarships worth \$5,500. These students are ranked in the top 10 percent of their high school class and have scored 1,200 or better on the Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Another 93 students received Incentive Scholarships worth \$1,500-\$4,500, depending on their class rank and SAT score. Eighteen of the 101 scholarship winners are residents of the Fayetteville/Cape Fear region.

Methodist's Incentive Scholarships are funded entirely by the college, largely from endowment earnings. To be eligible for an Incentive Scholarship, a student must be a freshman or transfer student with fewer than 32 semester credit hours, be ranked in the top 20 percent of his/her high school class, and have scored 900 or above on the SAT. Incentive Scholarships range in value from \$2,000-\$5,500 for resident students and \$1,500-\$3,200 for commuting students.

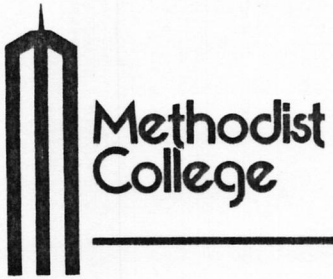

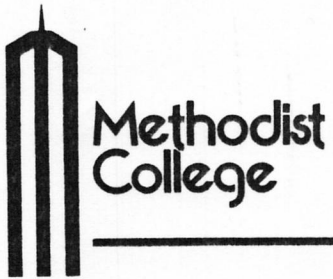

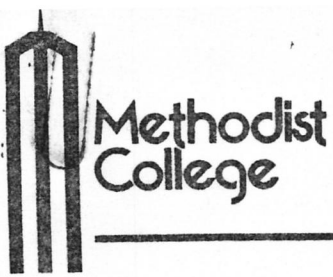
