METHODIST COLLEGE HONORS DETROIT MINISTER

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--A Methodist College Medallion was awarded May 6 to the Reverend Dr. William K. Quick, pastor of Metropolitan United Methodist Church in Detroit.

Reverend Quick was honored for his efforts to preserve and strengthen United Methodist colleges, universities, and seminaries and for 37 years of distinguished service as a United Methodist preacher. He became pastor of Detroit's Metropolitan United Methodist Church in 1974.

A native of Scotland County, NC, William Quick was educated at Pfeiffer College, Randolph-Macon College, and Duke University Divinity School. He has served as a trustee of Louisburg, Methodist, Scarritt, and Adrian colleges and currently serves on the board of visitors of Duke Divinity School.

The Methodist College Medallion honors persons who have made outstanding contributions to society, the church, and Christian higher education.

Chartered in 1956 and opened in 1960, Methodist College is a four-year, co-educational college of liberal arts and sciences with a full-time enrollment of 1,000 students.

METHODIST COLLEGE AWARDS 127 DEGREES AT 27TH SPRING COMMENCEMENT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College awarded 127 degrees to 124 persons at its 27th spring commencement Sunday, May 6.

Dr. Larry G. Rowedder, superintendent of the Cumberland County schools, challenged members of the Class of 1990 to accept the responsibilities of a professional and to make the world a better place. He said the body of human knowledge is now doubling every one and a half years, making it imperative that humans "learn to adapt "to rapid technological change.

Dr. Rowedder urged the degree candidates to accept the responsibilities of a professional: 1) to advance the body of knowledge in one's chosen field, 2) to maintain personal integrity and a code of ethics in dealing with others, 3) to serve one's community, and 4) to never stop learning.

The Reverend Dr. William K. Quick, pastor of Metropolitan United Methodist Church in Detroit, Michigan, delivered the baccalaureate sermon Sunday morning. He challenged members of the graduating class to spread their wings and soar like eagles -- to seek a new discovery each day and to match their personal efforts to their abilities.

Methodist College President Elton Hendricks presented a Methodist College Medallion to Reverend Quick during the commencement ceremony, in recognition of his 37 years of distinguished service to the United Methodist Church, Methodist College, and society.

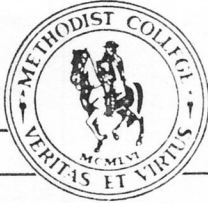

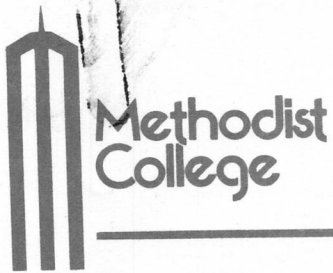

METHODIST COLLEGE SCIENCE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION GRANT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The National Science Foundation has awarded Methodist College a matching grant of \$10,237 through its Instrumentation and Laboratory Improvement Program.

The grant will be used to purchase a high-speed centrifuge for subcellular fractionation in a cell physiology course. Dr. Margaret Folsom, professor of biology and head of Methodist's Science Department, said the new centrifuge will enable biology students to better separate the smaller cellular components and analyze enzyme activity.

"I'm very excited about this," said Dr. Folsom, "because it's an affirmation of our coming of age as a biology department. These instrumentation grants are very competitive."

Dr. Folsom said College President Elton Hendricks helped her write and edit the 20-page NSF grant proposal. She said the NSF grant will be applied to the purchase of a Sorvall Superspeed centrifuge and an additional rotor for the college's current IEC centrifuge. Dr. Folsom said the new equipment will be purchased this fall and will be ready for use by cell physiology students next spring.

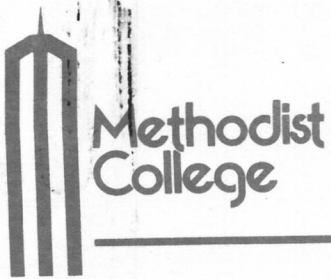
