

METHODIST COLLEGE PREPARES FOR FALL OPENING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College is a beehive of activity this week, as faculty and staff prepare for the arrival of new students Saturday, August 18.

The college football and soccer teams begin practice Tuesday, August 14. All faculty members report for the new year Wednesday, August 15. College President Elton Hendricks will host an "opening of school" dinner for faculty and staff Friday, August 17.

Methodist begins fall classes August 22 for day students and August 27 for evening students. College officials are expecting 1,000 day students and 500-600 evening students.

The college enters its 31st academic year and fourth decade with a major infusion of new leadership. Raleigh newscaster Charlie Gaddy is the new chairman of the board of trustees. Fayetteville businessman Vance Neal is chairman of the board of visitors. Fayetteville banking executive James Cherry is president of the Methodist College Foundation.

Three of the college's five vice presidents are new to their posts. They are: Dr. Erik Bitterbaum, vice president for academic affairs; Mr. Gene Clayton, vice president for business affairs; and Mr. Thomas W. Williams Jr., vice president for development.

New additions to the campus include the March F. Riddle Physical Activities Center, a five-hole golf course, and a small welcome center near the south entrance.


Approximately 65 students will receive degrees during the college's 17th summer commencement, slated for 3 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium.

MC PERFORMING ARTS SCHOOL ANNOUNCES FALL CLASSES

*PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Methodist College Preparatory School for the Performing Arts will begin fall semester classes in music, dance, and gymnastics September 10.

Designed for young children and teenagers, the school offers after-school classes in music, dance, and gymnastics — one class a week for 13 weeks. A new offering this year is "Kindermusik Beginnings" for children ages 18 months — three years (with parent or caregiver). This course will be taught Wednesday mornings at the Arts Center on Hay Street and Tuesday mornings at Methodist College.

Other music courses include: "First Music," "Class Piano for Beginners," "Suzuki Violin and Cello," and private lessons in piano, organ, voice, violin, guitar, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, and trombone.

Three types of dance classes -- "Kinderdance," jazz, ballet, tap and modern dance -- will be taught by Dorothy Davis. Gymnastics classes for three different age groups will be taught by Omega Gymnastics.

Fees for courses range from \$99 for dance classes to \$280 for 13 hours of private instruction. Private lessons are also offered at \$140 for 13 30-minute sessions and \$210 for 13 45-minute sessions. 

CONCERT BY LOCAL VOCALIST TO FEATURE FRENCH CANTATA

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Mrs. Diane Guthrie, a soprano and music instructor at Methodist College, will give a concert Sunday, September 22 at the Arts Center in downtown Fayetteville. The concert is free and begins at 4:00 p.m.

For the first part of her program, Mrs. Guthrie will perform an 18th century French cantata written by Parisian composer/performer Elisabeth-Claude Jacquet de La Guerre. Entitled "Le Passage de la Mer Rouge" (The Passage Through the Red Sea), the 1708 composition has been heard only a few times during the last 280 years. La Guerre's musical notation was not standardized, making her compositions difficult to read. For her doctoral dissertation at UNC-Greensboro, Mrs. Guthrie prepared a modern score of La Guerre's cantata that can be read by today's performers.

Elisabeth La Guerre wrote 15 vocal cantatas, harpsichord pieces, trio sonatas, and an opera -- all dedicated to her patron, King Louis XIV. Her solo cantatas were among the first published in France and among the first to be based on Biblical subjects.

Mrs. Guthrie will be accompanied by Mary Frances Boyce (baroque violin) and visiting artists Carol Marsh (viola de gamba), Lynn Gardner (harpsichord) and Andrew Mock (piano).

In the second part of her program, Mrs. Guthrie will sing a German lieder by Gustav Mahler, a French melody by Claude Debussy, and a musical theatre selection by Leonard Bernstein.

Mrs. Guthrie's concert will be given at UNC-Greensboro September 29 and at Pfeiffer College October 8. The Fayetteville concert is being sponsored by Methodist College, the Chaminade Music Club, the Lafayette Society and the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County with a grant from the Grassroots Arts Program of the North Carolina Arts Council, a state agency.
