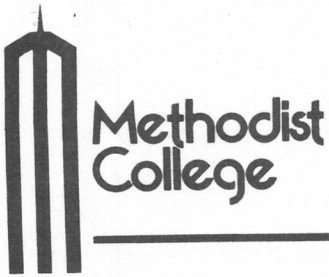

BAKER, TISDALE TO DISCUSS ECONOMIC OUTLOOK FOR 1991

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--L. M. Baker Jr., president and chief executive officer of Wachovia Corporation and Wachovia Bank & Trust Co., will deliver the keynote address at the Outlook for 1991 Symposium Thursday, Nov. 15 at Methodist College.

Is America entering a recession? "Mr. Baker is in a good position to answer this question and tell us what to expect in 1991," noted Dr. Sid Gautam, economics professor at Methodist.

Mr. Baker holds an M.B.A. from the University of Virginia and a bachelor's degree from the University of Richmond. He also serves as executive vice president of First Wachovia Corporation.

James O. Tisdale, president of the Fayetteville Area Chamber of Commerce, will also address the gathering. He will discuss the outlook for Cumberland County in 1991.

The banquet and symposium are slated for 7 p.m. in the Methodist College cafeteria. A reception will be held at 6:30 p.m.

Methodist College will recognize outstanding business achievements in 1990 by presenting awards to: the Entrepreneur of the Year, an outstanding business student (Wall Street Journal Award), Economics and Business Alumnus of the Year, and the Business Person of the Year.

The symposium is sponsored jointly by the Fayetteville Area Chamber of Commerce, the N.C. Small Business and Technology Development Center, and the Center for Entrepreneurship at Methodist College.

METHODIST COLLEGE TO AWARD HONORARY DEGREES TO HELEN CROTWELL, ALLEN NORRIS

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College will award honorary doctorates to United Methodist leaders Helen Gray Crotwell and J. Allen Norris Jr. Dec. 14 at the college's 18th winter commencement.

Rev. Crotwell will receive the Doctor of Divinity degree. Her 41-year career in the ministry includes service at Winthrop College, St. Mary's College, Duke University, and three churches in North Carolina. She is now serving as superintendent of the Fayetteville District, North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. A native of Newberry, S.C., she earned degrees at Georgia State College for Women, Candler School of Theology at Emory University, and Duke University Divinity School.

Dr. Allen Norris, president of Louisburg College, will receive the Doctor of Humanities degree. A native of Raleigh, NC, Dr. Norris earned three degrees at Duke University and taught education there and at Rollins College before becoming president of Louisburg in 1975. In June, he and his wife Beth were named Lay Persons of the Year by the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church.

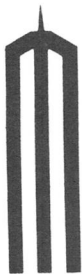
