BEN RUFFIN TO SPEAK AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYEITEVILLE, NC-Ben Ruffin, one of America's leading experts on Afro-American issues, will speak at Methodist College's spring convocation January 22. His topic will be "The Black Male Crisis."

Designed to commemorate Black History Month, the lecture will be held at 11 a.m. in Reeves Auditorium. It is free and open to the public.

Mr. Ruffin is vice president of corporate affairs for R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Co. in Winston-Salem. A graduate of North Carolina Central University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, he is nationally known as an orator and an expert on Afro-American issues. He previously worked as a special assistant to North Carolina Governor James B. Hunt Jr.

In his position with R. J. Reynolds Tobacco, Mr. Ruffin is responsible for developing partnerships with minority business, civic, and professional organizations. While serving under Governor Hunt, he was responsible for increasing the number of black judges in the state and expanding the number of blacks employed in state government.

METHODIST COLLEGE TO PARTICIPATE IN SEARS TEACHING EXCELLENCE PROGRAM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC-Methodist College has been selected to participate in the Sears-Roebuck Foundation's 1990-91 Teaching Excellence and Campus Leadership Award Program.

"At Methodist College, our primary emphasis is on quality teaching, with the student as our central focus," said College President Elton Hendricks. "We are especially pleased that the Sears-Roebuck Foundation has maintained its long-standing partnership with independent higher education by continuing this teacher recognition program."

Methodist received a \$2,000 grant from the Sears-Roebuck Foundation in 1989-90 for the recognition of teaching excellence. Dr. Linda Sue Barnes, professor of biology at Methodist College, won the college's first Sears Foundation Teaching Excellence Award in 1990. She was selected by a student/faculty committee.

"This award is a great honor," said Dr. Barnes, "and I deeply appreciate Sears' commitment to education. The 1990 grant enabled the Methodist College Science Department to acquire its own VCR with TV monitor."

The foundation supports awards programs at nearly 700 of the nation's leading independent liberal arts colleges and universities. Each winning faculty member receives \$1,000 and the institution receives a grant of from \$500 to \$1,000 based on student enrollment. The Sears award program is administered nationally by the Stamford, Connecticut-based Foundation for Independent Higher Education and regionally by the Independent College Fund of North Carolina.

"We salute Sears in recognizing one of society's most fundamental needs, excellence in teaching," said John P. Blessington, F.I.H.E. president. "These awards will honor some of our nation's best educators and encourage others to emulate them."



TROY HOWARD TO CHAIR METHODIST COLLEGE LOYALTY FUND DRIVE

Methodist College has a current operating budget of \$9.7 million. Its revenue sources are: tuition and fees, 70 percent; auxiliary enterprises, 18 percent; United Methodist Church, 5 percent; endowment earnings, 5 percent; gifts and grants, 2 percent.


