METHODIST COLLEGE FORUMS TO EXAMINE 'THE BILL OF RIGHTS IN EVERYDAY LIFE'

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College will stage three forums commemorating the 200th anniversary of the Bill of Rights Feb. 12, 19, and 26. The series is entitled "The Bill of Rights in Everyday Life."

Area citizens are encouraged to attend any or all of the forums and to claim a free reproduction of the original Bill of Rights. The forums are slated for three consecutive Tuesdays at 7:30 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium.

"We are fighting for freedom abroad!" said Dr. Suzan Cheek, series coordinator. "Let's think about the challenges to freedom at home. Issues such as artistic freedom, rights of AIDS victims, and drug-fighting tactics need to be viewed in light of the Bill of Rights."

The Bill of Rights forum Feb. 12 will be a roundtable discussion on the topic "Public Order vs. Individual Freedom." Retired N.C. Court of Appeals Judge Charles Becton will lead a panel of 20 local experts in a discussion of everyday challenges to individual freedoms.

The second forum Feb. 19 will be a mock trial entitled "Is Looking Suspicious a Crime?" Local attorneys and citizens will participate in the trial and a jury will be drawn from the audience.

The series will conclude Feb. 26 with an address by Angus Thompson, public defender from Robeson County. Mr. Thompson will speak on the topic "Living With the Bill of Rights In the 1990's." Congressman Charlie Rose will also speak.

METHODIST COLLEGE STUDENTS TO STAGE VALENTINE'S DAY TRIBUTE TO AMERICAN TROOPS
SERVING IN MIDDLE EAST

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Two Methodist College students with spouses serving in the Middle East have organized a Valentine's Day Tribute to American Troops.

Designed as a "patriotic rally," the tribute is slated for 11 a.m. in the bell tower courtyard at Methodist College. The public is invited. Speakers at the rally will include: College President Elton Hendricks, Fayetteville Mayor J. L. Dawkins, Student Government Association President Dawn Thompson, and an Army veteran.

"We have two purposes in mind," said the organizers, "first, to let the soldiers in the Persian Gulf know they have American support and second, to encourage people to think about the goals of Operation Desert Storm."

Patriotic songs will be performed at several points during the rally. A student whose husband is serving with the Army's 82nd Airborne Division will sing. The rally will close with group singing of the United Nations hymn "Let There Be Peace On Earth."

At least 10 college staff members and two dozen students at Methodist have close family members serving in the Persian Gulf. Two prayer vigils for peace have already been held on campus -- one Jan. 14 and one Jan. 16. In addition, special counseling has been offered to military dependents.

METHODIST COLLEGE FOUNDATION TO CONDUCT ANNUAL FUND DRIVE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Methodist College Foundation will launch its 34th annual Loyalty Fund Drive Feb. 19.

Foundation President James Cherry said 100 volunteers will gather Feb. 19 at the college for a kickoff breakfast. Volunteers will spend the rest of the day canvassing the business community for pledges.

Troy Howard, executive vice president of Belk Department Stores in the Fayetteville area, is the 1991 campaign chairman. "Investing in Methodist College is more than supporting a school," said Howard, "It is supporting our community and our future."

The goal for the 1991 fund drive is \$175,000. The first \$70,000 raised will be applied to debt retirement -- a \$1 million loan made for the original construction of the campus. The balance will be used in a variety of ways to support college operations during the current fiscal year.

Methodist College has a current operating budget of \$9.8 million. Seventy percent of its revenues are derived from tuition and fees. Other revenue sources are: auxiliary enterprises, 18 percent; United Methodist Church, 5 percent; endowment earnings, 5 percent; gifts and grants, 2 percent.

The Methodist College Foundation is the successor to the Fayetteville College Foundation which was formed in 1955 to bring a church-related college to Cumberland County. In 1956, the foundation entered negotiations with the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Church and pledged \$2 million in construction

funds, 600 acres of land for the campus, and a minimum of \$50,000 in annual sustaining funds for Methodist College.

Over the last 30 years, the Methodist College Foundation has raised amounts ranging from \$78,000 to \$340,000 annually. The group has increased its annual goal several times to a current figure of \$175,000. The foundation has exceeded this goal in each of the last four years. Since 1957, the foundation has raised more than \$5.6 million in sustaining funds for Methodist College.

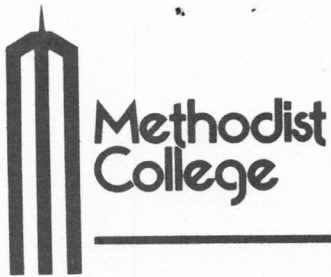

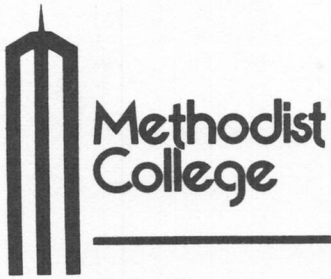
