METHODIST COLLEGE CHEERLEADERS RECEIVE NATIONAL RANKING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Methodist College cheerleaders have received a 7th place national ranking by the Universal Cheerleaders Association.

The Monarch cheerleading squad competed in UCA's Division II, which consists of all NCAA Division II and III colleges and all NAIA schools. Methodist placed higher than any NCAA Division III college and was the only one from North Carolina to make the top ten in Division II.

Methodist's cheerleaders were judged and ranked from a videotape, which included highlights of their season, as well as a cheer/stunt, sideline, and fight song. The top six squads in Division II were invited to participate in the 1991 national championships, to be held in San Antonio in April.

Greg Rumsey, first-year coach of the Methodist cheerleaders, said he was proud of his young squad. He was also optimistic about next year, saying "The experience they have gained, combined with the talent of some fine recruits, should result in an even higher finish next season and hopefully a trip to San Antonio."

This Shakespearean tragedy will be presented Friday and Saturday at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday at 3:00 p.m. in O'Hanlon Amphitheater on the college campus. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$3 for children and senior citizens.

The Montague-Capulet family feud is placed this time in a 1991 Mardi Gras celebration. The feud interrupts the festivities of a Dixieland band and Mardi Gras celebrants and ultimately causes the deaths of the beautiful young lovers.

The amphitheater will be filled with the sounds of dances, music and celebrants in this unusual production set in a contemporary setting reminiscent of the French Quarter in New Orleans. Dr. Jack Peyrouse is the director and Mr. Paul Wilson is set designer for the production.

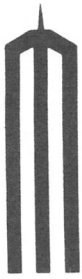
