METHODIST COLLEGE TO HONOR LEE SMITH

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College's 10th annual Southern Writers' Symposium, slated for Sept. 27-28, will examine the works of popular novelist and short story writer Lee Smith.

Dr. Sue Kimball, director of the college's 10th annual Southern Writers' Symposium, said of this year's honoree, "Lee Smith is better than good. Fair and Tender Ladies, which I see as a 'tour de force,' is a magnificent piece of writing."

Ms. Smith has written seven novels and two short story collections. A native of Grundy, Virginia, she wrote her first novel, The Last Day the Dogbushes Bloomed, while a student at Hollins College. That novel won her a fellowship from the Book of the Month Club.

Lee Smith's writing has won her numerous honors: two O'Henry Awards for short stories (1979, 80), the Sir Walter Raleigh Award (1984), and the North Carolina Award for Literature (1985). The Fellowship of Southern Writers recently presented her its first annual Chubb LifeAmerica Fiction Award in honor of Robert Penn Warren.

In addition to writing, Ms. Smith has worked as a journalist and teacher. Since 1981, she has taught creative writing at N.C. State University. She is currently a Fellow at the Center for Documentary Studies at Duke University. The Chapel Hill resident is working on a novel about a country music duo--two sisters carrying on a family tradition.

At a spring Fellowship of Southern Writers' conference in Chattanooga, Dr. Kimball revealed plans for the symposium, which is officially titled "Lee Smith, Storyteller". Ms. Smith received the ChubbLife America Fiction Award at the Chattanooga conference.

Dr. Kimball's call for papers on Lee Smith, issued last spring, generated a record 40 responses. A total of 23 papers will be read at the two-day event.

Several of the presenters are personally acquainted with Lee Smith. They include: Nancy Parrish (The College of William and Mary), Jill McCorkle (UNC), Dorothy Combs Hill (Georgetown U.), and Kay Byer (Appalachian State U.). "Two English professors -- John Calabro from West Point and Frances Kestler from St. John's University -- are coming just to introduce speakers," said Dr. Kimball.

Lee Yopp, director of the Fort Bragg Playhouse is working on a stage adaptation of Smith's novel Family Linen. Bo Thorp and Bob Bloodworth will be featured in the play, which will be staged Sept. 27 and 28 at 8:15 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium.

Several artists have already entered the juried art show and are preparing works based on Smith's writings. The show is scheduled for Sept. 28, from 4:30-5:30 p.m. in the Mallett-Rogers House. A First Prize of \$500 will be awarded. The entry deadline is August 15.

Special music will be provided at the Friday and Saturday dinners by the Methodist College Music Department. "Pop music composer Bruce Hornsby was inspired to write 'The Valley Road' and 'The Road Not Taken' after reading Lee Smith's Oral History," said Dr. Kimball. "One of those songs will be performed."

The opportunity to meet southern writers is an important part of the annual Symposium. Lee Smith will speak at the Friday dinner and will also attend the

play, art show, and several other events. In the last four years, honorees Reynolds Price, Doris Betts, and John Ehle have all journeyed to Methodist.

"I hope Tar Heel residents will take advantage of this special event," said Dr. Kimball. "We can all learn greatly from writers like Lee Smith. Continuing education units will be offered for teachers and others who need them."

N.C. HUMANITIES COUNCIL AWARDS GRANT TO SUPPORT SOUTHERN WRITERS' SYMPOSIUM.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- The North Carolina Humanities Council (NCHC) has awarded Methodist College a \$1,200 grant for its fall Southern Writers' Symposium. Entitled "Lee Smith Storyteller," the symposium will be held September 27-28 at the college.

The grant will be used to underwrite a stage production of Smith's novel, Family Linen; a juried art show, and other special activities associated with the two-day event. Twenty-three guest lecturers will present papers about Lee Smith and her writing. Ms. Smith, the honoree, will attend a luncheon and dinner, the play opening, and the art show.

"With funding from the NCHC we will be able to produce a quality program that is both educational and entertaining," said Dr. Sue Kimball, project director.

The North Carolina Humanities Council uses federal money made available by the National Endowment for the Humanities and gifts from private sources in the state. The NCHC makes grants to non-profit organizations for humanities programs.

The NCHC supports programs that draw upon history, literature, and languages to examine issues and illuminate cultural dimensions of American society through the exchange of ideas between people. The NCHC is made up of volunteer citizens who meet three times a year to review proposals submitted by non-profit community organizations and institutions.

**METHODIST COLLEGE ESTABLISHES ALBRITTON-HURLEY SCHOLARSHIP**

FAYETTEVILLE, NC - Dr. M. Elton Hendricks, president of Methodist College, today announced the establishment of a new scholarship program for active duty military personnel. The scholarship has been established to recognize the achievements of active duty military personnel involved in the recent Desert Shield/Desert Storm Operations and the Vietnam War.

The Albritton-Hurley Scholarship honors two soldiers who attended Methodist College -- Lt. Kenneth Albritton who was killed in Vietnam in 1968 and Sergeant Major Patrick Hurley, who died earlier this year in Operation Desert Storm.

The new scholarship is designed to bridge the gap between the cost of tuition in the regular day program and the assistance already available from federal and state financial aid programs. Dr. Hendricks said the scholarship is designed to help enlisted men from Fort Bragg who reenlist under the Army's College Option Reenlistment Program. That program permits soldiers to attend a college of their choice for one semester, in a regular day program, as a benefit of their reenlistment.

Dr. Hendricks noted that while Methodist College had refunded all fees received for active duty and reserve personnel who had to withdraw from college because of Operation Desert Storm, he felt the college should do something further to help those whose education were interrupted by the Persian Gulf War.

METHODIST COLLEGE PREPARES FOR FALL OPENING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Methodist College begins its 32nd academic year August 21, with the start of day classes. Evening classes began August 5.

Approximately <sup>415</sup>400 new students are expected Saturday August 17, followed by 580 returning students August 19. Another 391 students are already enrolled in evening classes.

Methodist College opens with two new majors -- international relations and criminal justice/legal studies -- and nine new faculty members. Dr. M. Elton Hendricks begins his ninth year as college president.

Two accreditation efforts are on the agenda for 1991-92. The teacher education program will be reviewed next spring by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. The social work program will be upgraded to prepare for accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education.

Other changes include a 12-point grading scale in which quality points are weighted for letter grades with pluses or minuses. The college will inaugurate a special inter-term of three weeks duration (December 30 - January 17) between the fall and spring terms, offering special classes. Methodist is also developing a foreign exchange program with Yanbian University (Peoples Republic of China) to begin in 1992-93.

Several physical improvements were made to the campus during the summer. A new phone system was installed, which gives the public direct lines to each office and makes phone service available to each resident student. A new computer lab for business and teacher education students was added. The student store, post office, and Teaching Materials Center were all renovated. Holes four and five were constructed on the college golf course; the nine-hole course is slated for completion in the summer of 1992.

**METHODIST COLLEGE ENROLLS 1,373 FOR FALL SEMESTER**

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College opened its 32nd academic year August 21 with 1,373 students, 9 percent more than last year.

The college enrolled 982 students in the regular day program and 391 students in the Evening College. Day enrollment showed a one percent increase over last year's 972, while the evening program registered a 14 percent gain over last year's 308.

A total of 492 students are living on campus, compared with 495 last fall. "We are pleased with our residential enrollment," said College President Elton Hendricks.

Methodist enrolled 445 new students -- 279 freshman, 136 transfers, and 30 readmits. The Admissions Office reports that 246 of the new students are resident students and 199 are commuters.

The new students represent 32 different states and five foreign countries. Sixty-two percent of the new students are from North Carolina and forty-five percent are from Cumberland County.

The college begins the new year with two new majors -- international relations and criminal justice/legal studies. Dr. Elton Hendricks begins his ninth year as college president.

Two accreditation efforts are on the agenda for 1991-92. The teacher education program will be reviewed next spring by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). The social work program will be upgraded to prepare for accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education.

Other changes at the college include a 12-point grading scale in which students will receive letter grades with pluses and minuses and quality points weighted to match. A mentor program will be offered pairing students who need special tutoring with other students who have volunteered to be "mentors".

A number of physical improvements were made to the campus during the summer. A new phone system was installed, giving the public direct lines to each resident student. The student store, post office, and Teaching Materials Center were renovated. Holes four and five were constructed on the college golf course; the nine-hole course is slated for completion in the summer of 1992.
