COMMUNITY CHORUS/ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM MOZART REQUIEM AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- A College/Community Chorus and Orchestra assembled by the Methodist College Music Department will perform Mozart's "Requiem in D Minor" Wednesday, Nov. 20 at 8 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium. Admission is free.

Mr. Alan M. Porter, professor of music at Methodist College, will conduct the requiem mass. Guest soloists will include: Mrs. Diane Guthrie, soprano; Mrs. Teresa Batson, mezzo-soprano; Mr. Richard Bicoy, tenor; and Mr. Wesley Rowell, bass.

The "Requiem in D Minor" was Mozart's last major composition and was unfinished at the time of his death in December, 1791. A close associate completed the work which Mozart began. Conductor Alan Porter describes it as "one of the greatest requiem masses ever written."

This performance is the third and final in a series of free, college-sponsored events designed to showcase Mozart's music in the bicentennial year of his death.

METHODIST COLLEGE TO OFFER 'INTERIM' TERM BETWEEN FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Methodist College will launch its first "Interim" term December 30. The three-week "Interim" will allow students to take courses between the fall and spring semesters.

The new term was proposed by Dr. Erik Bitterbaum, Vice President for Academic Affairs, endorsed by the faculty, and approved by the president. Twelve different courses are being offered. One communications course, "Special Topics: Media in New York," includes a chaperoned week-long tour of New York City.

Most "Interim" courses are semester courses which carry three semester hours credit. Classes will meet every day for three hours. Tuition is \$90 per semester hour.

Students will have the option of living in a college residence hall (cost: \$100) and buying their meals in the college snack bar. Students enrolled at other colleges are welcome, but will need a visiting student letter from their home institution.

The opening of the spring semester was pushed back 10 days to accommodate the interim term. The spring semester will now begin January 21 and graduation will occur on May 17.

# INTERIM PROGRAMS

December 30, 1991 to January 17, 1992

## REGISTRATION

The registration deadline for Interim courses is December 30, 1991, unless the instructor has established an earlier date (see course description). Early registration is also possible beginning November 1, 1991. Students may register at the Registrar's Office, Horner Administration Building, during regular business hours. A student may register for only one course during the Interim. Permission to audit can be granted only to students who pay full tuition and all program fees associated with these courses for study.

The Interim session announcement is a supplement to the 1991-92 Catalogue. All course offerings listed in this schedule are subject to change or cancellation in cases of insufficient enrollment. Classes enrolling fewer than six students may or may not be cancelled as the instructor chooses. Generally, regular classes enrolling six or more students will be guaranteed unless the course involves travel with a stated minimum. **Registration is complete only when the enrollment form is signed and payment is made in the Business Office.**

## DROPS, ADDS, WITHDRAWALS

Students may **drop** any course without academic penalty before December 31, 1991; thereafter, a grade will be recorded. Students may **add** a class not later than December 31, 1991. Students may **withdraw** from a class with a grade of either passing (WP) or failing (WF) through the last day of Interim. Course withdrawals must be filed in the Registrar's Office.

## INTERIM TUITION

Tuition is computed at the rate of \$90.00 per credit hour. Tuition and fees are payable in full no later than the first day of class. Students who find it necessary for any reason to withdraw from the Interim must withdraw not later than December 31, 1991 to receive a refund. Please see the Business Office for details.

Food, lodging, books, transportation, personal, and miscellaneous expenses are not included in the tuition fees and must be provided by the student.

## ROOM AND BOARD

On campus housing will be available for Residence Hall students registered for Interim. The Interim room rate is \$100.00 (shorter room stays may be prorated). Students may enter the residence halls after 12 P.M. on Sunday, December 29, 1991. Students may purchase meals in **the snack bar** on a cash basis. Additional information may be obtained from the Office of Student Affairs.

**BUS 485 Marketing Problems** 3 s.h.  
Professor: Ms. Tracey Tuten T-207  
A case course based upon decision-making within the context of marketing strategy. Emphasis is placed upon analysis involving market segmentation. No textbook required: instructor will supply necessary reading materials.

**COM 485 Special Topics: Media in New York\*** 3 s.h.  
Professor: Mr. Robert Bloodworth T-245  
The course will include: A week of study on the Methodist campus of various mass communication media which will be seen in New York; Transportation to New York City by college van, departing January 7, 1992; Orientation session; five nights at the Edison Hotel in the heart of New York Theatre District; tickets to *Phantom of the Opera*; tickets to an Off-Broadway show; tickets to the taping of a syndicated talk show (probably *Donahue* or *The Joan Rivers Show*); visit to the Fashion Institute of Technology Costume Collection; tour of the NBC network facilities at 30 Rockefeller Plaza; broadcast seminar with a New York professional; tour of New York City TV production facility; tour of the New York Stock Exchange; transportation back to Methodist College by van; and the student will spend the last week of the course writing a term paper on some aspect of what he or she learned. Not included in the price is transportation around New York, food, incidentals, and entertainment other than that listed.  
Cost: Total package, including tuition, will range from \$769-\$869, based on the number of persons to a room; \$499-\$599 without credit for the course.

**COM 485 Special Topics: American Movie Genre** 3 s.h.  
Professor: Mr. Robert Bloodworth T-103  
This course will study the various American movie genres, such as Westerns, Swashbucklers, Romantic Comedies, Slapstick Comedies, Musical Comedies, Gangster Films, Horror Films, Science-Fiction Films, and Survival Films. We will study the ways in which the various genres are alike and how they differ. We will view clips from early examples of each genre and clips from contemporary examples of each genre to see how the various genres have evolved.
