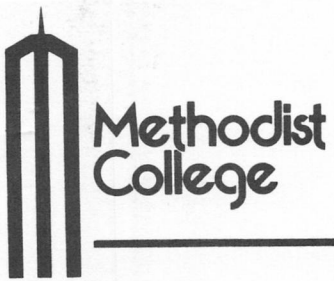



PLAYER TO CHAIR ANNUAL FUND DRIVE FOR METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Richard L. Player, Jr., president of Player, Inc., will chair the 35th annual Community Loyalty Campaign for Methodist College.

"Once a year, the Methodist College Foundation asks local citizens to help the college maintain and strengthen its educational programs by making a donation to the annual fund," said Mr. Player. "Methodist College is one of Fayetteville's greatest assets and deserves our wholehearted support."

Methodist's 1992 Loyalty Campaign will begin Tuesday, February 18 with a kickoff breakfast at the college. Fayetteville Mayor J. L. Dawkins has proclaimed February 18 Methodist College Loyalty Day.

Approximately 100 volunteers will canvas the business community for pledges on Loyalty Day. A total of 2,000 local businesses will be contacted, either in person or by mail. The Methodist College Foundation will acknowledge all donations in a newspaper ad and in a college publication.

The goal for the 1992 Community Loyalty Campaign is \$175,000. The first \$75,000 raised will be applied to debt retirement -- a \$1 million loan made for the original construction of the campus. The balance will be used to support current operations at the college.

Dr. Stanley Griffin, president of the Methodist College Foundation, expressed confidence that Dick Player will lead a "very successful" fund drive for the college.

Mr. Player has lived in Fayetteville since 1938, when his father founded Player Realty Company, later to become Player, Inc. -- Fayetteville's oldest general contracting company.

Dick Player is an honors graduate of Duke University, where he received a B.S. degree in civil engineering. He later earned an M.S. degree in structural engineering at the University of Illinois. A licensed professional engineer, he has served as president of Player, Inc. since 1961. He is also a general partner in Tri-Player Investments, which built and manages Westwood Shopping Center.

Mr. Player serves on the Board of Directors for Branch Banking and Trust Company and is a member of the statewide advisory board of the N.C. Small Business and Technology Development Center. He is a past president of the Fayetteville Kiwanis Club, Highland Country Club, the Fayetteville Area Chamber of Commerce, and the Methodist College Foundation. He has served on numerous local boards and commissions and has been a junior warden and senior warden at St. John's Episcopal Church.

Mr. Player and his wife Margaret have two children -- Molly, a graduate of Guilford College who lives in Greensboro, and Richard, III, a graduate of Methodist College now working with his father.

The Methodist College Foundation is the successor to the Fayetteville College Foundation formed in 1955 to bring a church-related college to Fayetteville. In 1956, the foundation entered negotiations with the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Church and pledged \$2 million in construction funds, 600 acres of land for the campus, and a minimum of \$50,000 in annual sustaining funds for Methodist College.

The Methodist College Foundation has increased its annual pledge several times to a current goal of \$175,000. Since 1957, the foundation has raised more than \$5.7 million in annual sustaining funds for the college.

METHODIST COLLEGE CHEERLEADERS TO COMPETE IN NATIONAL CHEERLEADING CHAMPIONSHIP

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- The Methodist College cheerleaders have been invited to compete in the National Collegiate Cheerleading Championships in San Antonio, Texas April 9-13.

Methodist's cheerleaders were selected on the basis of a videotape which they submitted to Universal Cheerleaders Association for judging. The Methodist team will compete in Division II against four other colleges. First, second, and third place prizes will be awarded in each division.

A total of 20 collegiate cheerleading teams will compete in three different divisions at the UCA Championships. Five of the 20 teams which qualified are from North Carolina. N.C. State University cheerleaders will defend their national title in Division IA. Teams from Appalachian State, UNC-Charlotte, and UNC-Wilmington will compete in Division I.

Methodist Cheerleading Coach Greg Rumsey said the UCA invitation is a great honor which resulted from a team effort and "a lot of hard work."

The UCA Championships will be videotaped by ESPN for rebroadcast in May.

METHODIST COLLEGE PROFESSOR TO PRESENT PAPER AT OXFORD

FAYETTEVILLE, NC -- Dr. Ken Collins, associate professor of religion and philosophy at Methodist College, will present a paper on John Wesley at the Oxford Institute of Methodist Studies next summer.

Dr. Collins was invited to present a paper at the international forum and to participate in the Wesley Studies Working Group at Somerville College, Oxford University. His paper is entitled "The Soteriological (Salvation) Orientation of John Wesley's Ministry to the Poor."

In an abstract of his paper, Dr. Collins says it developed out of a three-year study of John Wesley's 151 sermons for his book, "A Faithful Witness: John Wesley's Homiletical Literature." The book will be published this summer by Wesley Heritage Press. An earlier book by Dr. Collins, "Wesley on Salvation: A Study in the Standard Sermons," is required reading in many seminaries.

The thesis of Dr. Collins' paper is that Wesley viewed the salvation of souls as paramount in his ministry to the poor and felt Methodists should take the good news of salvation to the poor. In a sermon entitled "Visiting the Sick", noted Dr. Collins, "Wesley said that beyond meeting a patient's physical needs, Methodists should 'keep a higher end in view, even the saving of souls from death.'"

Dr. Collins is a native of Brooklyn, NY. He holds a bachelor's degree from State University of New York at Buffalo, master's degrees from Asbury Theological Seminary and Princeton Theological Seminary, and a Ph. D. from Drew University. Dr. Collins is an ordained elder in the Free Methodist Church of North America.

The Oxford Institute of Methodist Studies is held every five years. The theme for this year is "Good News to the Poor in the Wesleyan Tradition."
