METHODIST ENROLLS RECORD NUMBER OF STUDENTS

FAYETTEVILLE, NC-- Methodist College began its 33rd academic year by enrolling a record 1,072 students in its regular day program. The new total breaks the college's previous record of 1,069, set in the fall of 1967.

Another 365 students enrolled in the evening program at Methodist, producing a total enrollment of 1,437, up 4.6 percent over last fall's 1,373. Evening enrollment was down seven percent from last fall's 391.

Residential enrollment--the number of students living in the four residence halls--totalled 548. This is the largest number since the fall of 1968 and represents a 13.6 percent gain over last fall's 482.

"Methodist College continues to grow both in size, reputation and national visibility," said Dr. M. Elton Hendricks, college president. "It is a pleasure to have so many new, wonderful students with whom to work. I am proud of the entire staff at Methodist College whose creative efforts and hard work made our progress possible."

Methodist also enrolled 510 new students--302 freshmen and 208 transfers. The Admissions Office reports that 292 of the new students are living on campus and 218 are commuters.

The new students represent 33 different states and eight foreign countries. Sixty-six percent (335) of the new students are from North Carolina and 46 percent (235) are from Cumberland County.

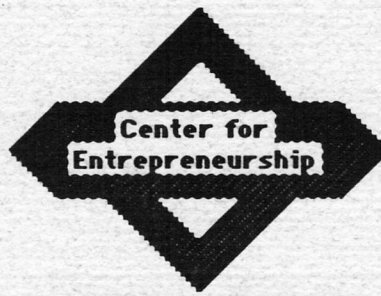
STUDENT POETS WIN AWARDS

Nineteenth Annual Economic Outlook Symposium

Set for Thursday, November 5, 1992

Remember Sweden. This Scandinavian country was famous for socialism, sex, and suspense. But for the moment forget it all. From now on, people, and especially financial professionals, will remember Sweden for raising its key lending rate to seventy-five percent. During the week of September 7, the key lending rate was sixteen percent. The question, however, about world currency markets and the alarming actions of currency traders forced the Riksbank, the central bank of Sweden, to raise the rate to twenty-four percent. Fearing a run on its currency, the authorities took the dramatic step of raising the lending rate to an incredible seventy-five percent. This increase from sixteen to seventy-five percent took place in just forty-eight hours.

The action of Riksbank may be an overreaction to protect a run on the krona, but every country in Europe has higher interest rates and higher inflation than does America. The German Central Bundesbank has kept its rate as high as nine and three-fourths percent. According to several prominent economists, "the deutschemark has caused currency disequilibrium in Europe." Consequently, "the weakest links are being hit first and hardest. This is a warning signal that the problem could easily filter into the next weakest link."

On September 4, Italy raised its discount rate to fifteen percent from thirteen and three-fourths to defend the lira. During the last two months Italy has raised interest rates so many times that one can get a one-month interest rate on money market funds as high as twenty-one and one-half percent.

After reading all this, please do not call your banker and broker to seek these higher yields. "With United States trading bills and money market funds paying a measly three percent, the lure of seventy-five percent short term interest rates in Sweden seems irresistible," noted the *Wall Street Journal*. It is not easy, however, to buy these securities. According to the Journal, "Yield-hungry United States investors can buy short-term Swedish debt securities of three to nine months' maturity with yields of eighteen percent to seventy-five percent—still enormous when composed with United States rates."

While the rates are in double digits across the Atlantic, Americans are witnessing the lowest interest rates and lowest inflation in many years. The lowest mortgage rate in twenty-seven years has not resulted in an avalanche of home buying. On the one hand, however, we have low interest rates and low inflation, but consumers are not spending money; investors, on the other hand, are overly cautious in making investment decisions and governments—local, state and federal—are hardpressed to increase spending. This year's budget deficits and record national debt do not make the job of fighting the prolonged recession by fiscal and monetary authorities any easier.

What lies ahead?

What will happen to inflation, interest rates, unemployment, deficits, taxes, and government spending? Come and join us on November 5, and listen to the Economic Outlook for 1993 and beyond.

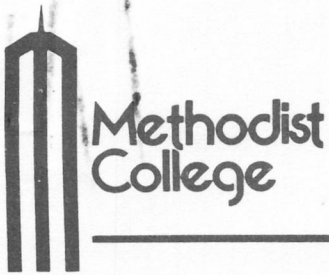
