METHODIST COLLEGE RECEIVES REYNOLDS GRANT FOR PARENT EDUCATION PROGRAM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College has received a \$15,000 grant from the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation for continuation of a parent education project at Fayetteville's Pauline Jones Elementary School.

The grant will support a five-month instructional program designed to show parents of disadvantaged fifth graders what they can do at home to improve the reading skills of their children. Entitled SPIRIT II, the program will offer monthly workshops for parents along with free books and periodicals and access to instructional software and personal computers. The program seeks to improve the reading skills of 60 fifth graders at Pauline Jones Elementary School, students who have been identified as reading below grade level.

The acronym SPIRIT stands for Students and Parents Involved in Reading Instruction Together. The program was inaugurated at Pauline Jones Elementary in January, 1992 and targeted fourth graders reading below grade level. The Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation awarded a \$25,000 grant to Methodist College for the initial program, which involved approximately 90 parents.

"We're very excited about this additional grant," said Mrs. Sally Austin, principal at Pauline Jones Elementary School. "We now have a core of parents who we feel will stay with us. Both CAT (California Achievement Test) scores and school attendance have improved significantly over the last two years and we think parental involvement is responsible. Last year our school was one of only five in North Carolina to receive the Golden Key Award (given by the N.C. Dept. of Public Instruction) for increasing parental involvement."

In addition to the reading sessions, school personnel at Pauline Jones have offered other

-MORE-

workshops for parents, both during the day and at night, since 1990. "We've been averaging 40 parents at our monthly meetings this fall," noted Mrs. Austin. Mrs. Austin said additional funds from the Cumberland County school system, Methodist College, and the United Way of Cumberland County will make it possible to involve parents of **all** Pauline Jones students (grades 4-6) in the reading workshops.

The six-member team that will direct SPIRIT II consists of : Mrs. Austin; Dr. Tony DeLapa, professor of education at Methodist College; Ms. Jennifer Jerch, instructor of education and English at Methodist; Mrs. Daisy Steward, parent/school community coordinator/PTA president; Mrs. Clarie White, a parent; and Mrs. Shirley Carlyle, media specialist at Pauline Jones.

Because SPIRIT II will serve many of the same parents and students who were involved last year, school and college personnel expect that CAT (California Achievement Test) scores from Spring '93 will be significantly higher than those recorded last spring. Last spring, fourth graders at Pauline Jones—this year's target group—scored at the 41st percentile in reading ability.
