FAYETTEVILLE, NC—North Carolina novelists Tim McLaurin and Phillip Gerard and poet Robin Greene will read excerpts from their works at Methodist College's Second Annual Writers' Day Monday, February 1.

Approximately 180 area high school students have accepted invitations to attend, reports Dr. Michael Colonnese, assistant professor of English and director of the event.

During the morning, each student will attend a writing workshop conducted by members of the Methodist College English Department. Each student will chose one of the following classes: fiction, poetry, writing for the visual media, writing for popular magazines, and business writing. Students in each class will participate in a writing contest and cash awards will be given to students submitting the best work in each genre.

During the afternoon the guest writers will read from their works and answer questions from the students. Novelist Tim McLaurin is a Fayetteville native who now lives in Chapel Hill. Phillip Gerard novelist, short story writer, essayist—lives in Wilmington. Poet Robin Greene is a Fayetteville resident.

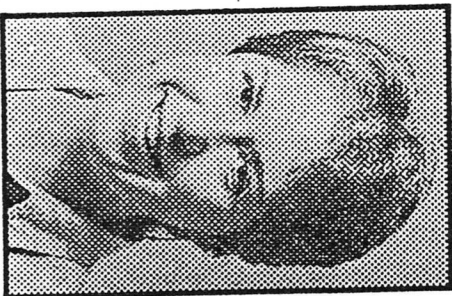

Tim McLaurin's recollections of his boyhood in East Fayetteville, published as *Keeper of the Moon: A Southern Boyhood*, has won North Carolina's most venerable literary award for non-fiction, the Mayflower Cup.

The Cumberland County writer, who lives in Chapel Hill now, sees himself primarily as a creative writer, beginning with his first novel, *The Acorn Plan*, based also on his boyhood in that "other Fayetteville," the humble district down by the Cape Fear River.

Fayetteville poet Robin Greene recently was awarded a \$7,500 Individual Artists' Fellowship by the North Carolina Arts Council, which is partially funded by the National Endowment for the Arts. She was one of four North Carolina writers to receive such funding.

Ms. Greene, an English instructor at Methodist College, was also the winner of the 1991 poetry chapbook contest sponsored by the North Carolina Writers' Network.

Her prizewinning collection, "Memories of Light," published this year by Harperprints of Henderson, N.C., has been praised for its author's exploration of the complicated human linkage with place.

Philip Gerard earned his MFA at the University of Arizona after a stint as a journalist and free-lance writer. His first novel, *Hatteras Light* (Scribners), was followed by a book of nonfiction, *Brilliant Passage* (Mystic Seaport), and a second novel, *Cape Fear Rising*, is due out in February 1994. Gerard is also the author of numerous short stories, reviews and essays, including nearly a hundred on-air essays for NPR's *All Things Considered*.
